HIS Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople has reported to His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, by telegraph, that the Ottoman Government will henceforth treat as contraband all foodstuffs, supplies and grain for fodder destined for the Allied Armies which may be run for ports on the Gulf of Xeros or near the Chatalja lines.

WHITEHALL, March 19, 1913.
