NOTICE is hereby given that His Majesty's Lord High Commissioner to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland will hold a Levée at His Majesty's Palace of Holyrood House, at 10.45 A.M., on Tuesday the 20th day of May, being the first day of Meeting of the General Assembly, on which occasion all those holding His Majesty's Commission or other Gentlemen are required to appear in uniform, court or evening dress.

The Procession will go by the Calton Hill, Princes Street, and the Mound.
