1. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars Regulation (County of Fife) (Kirkcaldy District) Order, 1913," and the Regulations hereby prescribed shall take effect within the limits or places referred to therein on and after the respective dates at which, for the purpose of giving effect thereto, the local authority shall, in terms of Section 10 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, place notices in conspicuous places on or near such limits or places.
2. A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour within the limits or places specified in the Schedule to this Order.

SCHEDULE.

Limits or Places.

Coaltown of Wemyss	From a point 150 yards west of the Hugo Pit level-crossing to the east end of the Gothenburg Public House feu.
Cross Roads Village	200 yards east and west from the junction with the road leading to Kirkland Village.
Kennoway ...	From a point at Denhead 480 yards west from the centre of Kirkcaldy to Cupar highway to the Free Church Manse on Leven Road, and from the Public School to the United Free Church Manse.
Windygates ...	50 yards on each of the four roads at the cross-roads.
Milton of Balgonie	From the bridge over the River Leven to the road leading to Balfour House at east end of village, and from said bridge to a point 430 yards north on Markinch Road.
Markinch ...	From the Railway Bridge to Balbirnie entrance gate at Sweet Bank Road, and to the entrance gate to Balbirnie at Stobecross.
Thornton ...	From the junction of the Station Road with the main road to the station.
Auchtertool ...	From "Milton" to the entrance to Auchtertool House.
Kinglassie ...	From the east end of the cemetery to the east end of the new school.
Auchterderran	From the south end of Donald Miners Rows to a point 100 yards east from B.M. No. 322.2 on Kinglassie Road, and from the entrance to Knobbs at west end of Jamphlars to the entrance to Carden Colliery.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 26TH JUNE 1913.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Importation.

1.—(1) The date on which Chapter I (*Importation*) of the Horses (Importation and Transit) Order of 1912 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) shall come into operation is hereby further altered to the first day of October nineteen hundred and thirteen.

(2) The first day of October nineteen hundred and thirteen shall be substituted for the first day of January nineteen hundred and thirteen in the Schedule to the principal Order (*Orders Revoked*).

Food and Water.

2. The provisions of paragraph (ix.) (*Food and Water*) of Article 13 of the principal Order shall not, until the first day of August nineteen hundred and thirteen, apply to a vessel on which horses, asses, or mules are carried to any port in Great Britain or from any such port to any port in the British Islands.
