### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

#### (DATED 11TH JULY 1913.)

#### (Swine Fever Infected Area.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

#### Further Contraction of Limits of Swine Fever Infected Area.

1. The limits of the Swine Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board, dated the ninth day of June nineteen hundred and thirteen, are hereby further contracted so as to comprise only the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby declared to be a Swine Fever Infected Area for

the purposes of the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

#### Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of July nineteen hundred and thirteen.
