MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

BURGH OF PORT-GLASGOW.

Notice is hereby given that the Town Council of the Burgh of Port-Glasgow have made application to the Secretary for Scotland praying that Regulations under the Motor Car Act should be made for the restriction of motor car traffic on certain roads in the Burgh.

Notice is hereby further given that the application, with relative Schedule and a map on a sufficient scale showing the roads proposed for restriction and the points where restriction begins and ends, may be inspected during office hours at the Office of the Town Clerk, and that objections to the making of any such Regulations may be sent in writing to the Secretary for Scotland at the Scottish Office, Whitehall, London, at any time within fourteen days of the date of publication of this advertisement. A copy of any such objection should be sent at the same time to the Town Clerk.
