BOARD OF TRADE (HARBOUR DEPARTMENT), LONDON, August 7, 1913.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch dated the 21st July last from His Majesty's Minister at Athens, stating that entrance to the Port of the Piræus is now free by day and night, and transmitting instructions for entering the port, of which the following is a translation :—

Every vessel making for the Piræus shall, so soon as she has the lights of Flévés and Kochi in line, continue to keep them so until the Psytalia (Lipso) lighthouse bears N.N.E. (N. 23 E.) magnetic.

After leaving this point she should steer for the lighthouse of Psytalia, and follow this course (N. 23 E.) until the light of Port Thémistoclès (two fixed green vertical lights) bears E.N.E. (N. 67 E.) magnetic.

She can then manœuvre freely to enter the port.

Vessels following this course pass to the west of a red buoy awash, and moored $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the south of the Psytalia lighthouse which marks the western end of the line of mines, most of which have already been removed.

In order to proceed to moorings in the Phalerum roadstead, vessels which have reached the line of the Thémistoclès light (E.N.E.) (indicated above) should keep close to the Piræus peninsula, having the red buoy always to starboard.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Board of Trade, and dated 27th April 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for the Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain-making trade, hereby give notice, as required by Section 4 of the above Act, that they purpose to vary the minimum time-rates for Dollied or Tommied Chain-making of 7/16"

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Board of Trade, and dated 27th April 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for the Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain-making trade, hereby give notice, as required by Section 4 of the above Act, that they propose to vary the minimum time-rate for Hand-hammered Chain-making fixed by them on 22nd August 1910, as follows :—

By increasing the minimum or lowest time-rate for making from iron supplied by the employer Hand-hammered Chain up to and including 11/32 inch.

Where the employer provides (in addition to the iron) the workshop where the work is carried on, and the tools and the fuel— from 2½d. per hour to 2⅔d. per hour (free and clear of all deductions).

Where the worker provides (in respect of iron provided by the employer) the workshop where the work is carried on and the tools

and the fuel, or any one of these three heads of outlay—from 3½d. per hour to 3⅔d. per hour (free and clear of all deductions).

The latter variation is on the basis that any carriage to or from the premises of the employer is performed by the worker; or that if performed by the employer the latter is entitled to receive 1d. per cwt. either way.

The Trade Board also give similar notice that they propose to vary the General Minimum Piece-rates fixed by them on 22nd August 1910, 23rd November 1910, and 1st February 1911, for making Hand-hammered Chain, as follows :—

That is to say, by the addition to such minimum rates of sums amounting approximately to 10 per cent.

The Trade Board also give similar notice that they propose to vary the General Minimum Piece-rates fixed for learners (as defined by them) on the dates specified above who are in the third and fourth six months of their em-

ployment, by the addition to such rates of sums amounting approximately to 10 per cent.
