Whereas by an Act passed in the Fourth Year of Our Reign intituled "An Act to make further and better provision for the care of Feeble-minded and other Mentally Defective Persons and to amend the Lunacy Acts" it is amongst other things enacted that there shall be constituted a Board of Control charged with the general superintendence of matters relating to the supervision, protection, and control of defectives, which Board shall consist of not more than fifteen Commissioners to be appointed by Us, of whom not more than twelve shall be paid Commissioners:

Now know ye, that We, pursuant to the powers vested in Us by the said recited Act, and on the recommendation of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, have appointed, and do by these Presents appoint you, the said Willoughby Hyett Dickinson and Ellen Francis Pinsent to be unpaid Commissioners for the purposes of the said Act.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, the twentieth day of November one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the fourth year of Our Reign.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH DECEMBER 1913.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Glasgow as a foreign animals wharf; that is to say:

All that space at Merklands, situate in the City of Glasgow, which is coloured yellow on the plan sealed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries for the purposes of this Order, and deposited at the office of the Board.

This Order shall be in operation from the thirteenth day of December to the twenty-seventh day of December nineteen hundred and thirteen (both days inclusive), and during that period no animals other than foreign animals shall be landed at or moved into or kept in the foreign animals wharf hereby defined.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries have hereunto set their Official Seal this twelfth day of December nineteen hundred and thirteen.

\* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.

POST OFFICE ANNUITY AND INSURANCE REGULATIONS, 1913.
