#### WHITEHALL, March 5, 1914.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto William MacConnell, Esq., His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to wear the Insignia of the Fourth Class of the Order of the Sacred Treasure, which Decoration has been conferred upon him by His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him.

#### FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has amended the draft Regulations in respect of the construction and repair of ships in shipbuilding yards, and that he proposes to make the Regulations in accordance with the amended draft, copies of which may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, London.

Objections to the amended draft Regulations by or on behalf of any person affected thereby must be sent to the Secretary of State within 21 days from the date of this notice.

Every such objection must be in writing, and must state (a) the draft Regulations or portions of draft Regulations objected to; (b) the specific grounds of objection; and (c) the omissions, additions, or modifications asked for.
