PRIZE COURTS ACT, 1894.

NOTICE is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council the Draft of an Order in Council for the amendment of the Rules of Court regulating the procedure and practice of Prize Courts, approved as *provisional* Rules under section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, by Order in Council of the 5th August 1914, and confirmed by Order in Council of the 17th September 1914.

The said amending Rules were approved as *provisional* Rules under section 2 of the last-named Act by Order in Council of the 30th September 1914.

Notice is hereby further given that, in accordance with the provisions of the last-named Act, copies of the proposed Rules can be obtained by any public body within forty days of date of this Notice at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

WHEREAS by the first section of the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, it is enacted as follows:—

“Her Majesty the Queen may, on being satisfied that the Legislature of any British Possession has made adequate provision for the recognition in that Possession of Probates and Letters of Administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom, direct by Order in Council that this Act shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications specified in the Order, apply to that Possession, and thereupon, while the Order is in force, this Act shall apply accordingly.”

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the

Legislature of the British Possession hereinafter mentioned has made adequate provision for the recognition in that Possession of Probates and Letters of Administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

The Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall apply to the British Possession hereunder mentioned :—

The Territory of Papua.

"And whereas owing to the operation of the regulations governing the employment of Officers of Your Majesty's Navy on shore a Rear-Admiral holding the position of Hydrographer has usually to accept retirement before advancement to the rank of Vice-Admiral :

"And whereas we consider that a Rear-Admiral who vacates this post should receive retired pay at the normal rate applicable to a Vice-Admiral :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of an Officer who vacates the post of Hydrographer while holding the rank of Rear-Admiral being granted retired pay at the rate of £725 a year, with effect as from 31st August 1914.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Wednesday the 7th inst., at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vict., cap. 2, 52 Vict., cap. 6, and 4 and 5 Geo. V., cap. 60, to the amount of £15,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1000, £5000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 10th October 1914, and will be payable at six months after date, viz., on the 10th April 1915.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Thursday the 8th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock on Saturday the 10th October 1914.

6. Persons tendering for Bills are hereby notified that, having regard to the provisions of the Acts 22 George III., cap. 45, and 41 George III., cap. 52, the acceptance of any such Tender is subject to the express condition that no Member of the House of Commons shall be admitted to any share or part in or to any benefit to arise from the Contract thereby made for the allotment of such Bills.

The provisions in question do not apply to Contracts entered into by an incorporated trading company in its corporate capacity and made for the general benefit of the company.
