The King has been pleased to grant to his Royal Highness Frederick Duke of York and Albany the Office of Keeper of his Majesty's Forests and Warren of Windsor, as also the office of Lieutenant of the said Forest, in the room of his Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester, deceased.

The King has also been pleased to constitute and appoint his Royal Highness Frederick Duke of York and Albany to be Warden and Keeper of the New Forest, in the county of Southampton, and also of the Manor and Park of Lindhurst, and the hundred of Rudbergh, in the room of his Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester, deceased.
