6866	Serjeant	Blakemore, G	. lst Battalion, Scottish Rifles	For consistent gallantry between 3rd October and 14th November, during which period he was instrumental in removing a large number of the enemy's snipers by his excellent marksmanship.

H	. 3rd Battalion, Cold- stream Guards	For conspicuous gallantry in continu- ally undertaking dangerous duties, especially on 9th November at Polygon Wood, when he assisted another man to clear a house occu- pied by German snipers. He also obtained valuable information the next day whilst on reconnaissance duty.
10223	Corporal	Bradford, W.	. 2nd Battalion, High- land Light Infantry	For conspicuous gallantry on 14th No- vember, after both Officers had been killed, he rendered great services by his good example to the men, whereby the trenches were held the whole day, notwithstanding heavy casualties.
3681	Company- Serjeant- Major	Bradish, A	. 2nd Battalion, Wor- cester Regiment	For gallantry and ability during the advance through a very difficult country under heavy fire. Rendered valuable assistance to Company Commander.
9740	Private	Carrington, R. H	1st Battalion, Leices- tershire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on 14th December at Rue Du Bois, when he saved the lives of two men who had been buried in a fire trench, being necessarily exposed to the enemy's machine - gun and rifle fire whilst doing so. Has shown remarkable bravery on previous occasions.
11681	Corporal	Chambers, A. G	5th Field Company, Royal Engineers	For gallant conduct on 11th Novem- ber. When his officer was killed he took command of the small party engaged in driving the enemy out of a wood, being met with very heavy machine-gun fire.
4516	Serjeant	Clark, E. J	. 15th Hussars	For very conspiouous ability and gallantry on 11th November at Herentage-Chateau. In conjunction with 30 Turcos under their serjeant, he held the Chateau against the German attack for two hours until our line was restored. The enemy's loss was over 100 on this occasion.
8767	Private	Clarke, J	1st Battalion, Shrop- shire Light Infantry	For very gallant conduct in going out in daylight for a distance of 100 yards in front of his trench, crossing a barbed-wire fence and rescuing a wounded comrade, under rifle fire.
7422	Private	Clarkson, J.	Ist Battalion, Leices- tershire Regiment	For gallant conduct at Vailly on 23rd September, in assisting to bring into cover a mortally wounded officer, under heavy shell and rifle fire.
24369	Second- Corporal	Clifford, F. W	. 3rd Section, 2nd Signal Company, Royal Engineers	For gallant conduct on 30th October, in remaining at his post working his instrument whilst the house he was in was being shelled. On several occasions during the day he went out under constant shell fire and sniping and repaired the tele- phone line.
8715	Private	Clifford, M	. 2 n d Battalion, Leinster Regiment	For gallantry on 20th October, in carry- ing messages under heavy machine- gun fire.
5291	Private	Cline, J. R	. 6th Dragoon Guards	For great gallantry on the night of 31st October, in taking up a position of great danger on the left of our line, which was out of touch with all other troops, and conveying in- formation of the enemy's move- ments. His action was instrumental in preventing a body of our troops from being surrounded.
