| 6818 | Private ... | Baker, T. ... | 1st Battalion King's Royal Rifle Corps | For conspicuous gallantry on the 19th September 1914, at the Soupir Ridge, in obtaining valuable information as to the enemy's position whilst exposed to shell fire. Was again brought to notice on 27th November for gallant conduct near Zonnebeke, in conveying messages on several occasions under very heavy machine-gun and shell fire. |
| 4930 | Serjeant ... | Bambridge, C. ... | 2nd Battalion, York and Lancaster Regiment | For gallantry and ability in reconnaissance duty on many occasions to the north of Vailly, in the vicinity of Maison Rouge, when he obtained useful information relation to the enemy's position. |
| 8713 | Private ... | Bantick, H. G. ... | 2nd Battalion, Royal Scots | For conspicuous gallantry at Vailly in voluntarily going close to the enemy to ascertain their strength, and, although at once attacked, succeeding in getting back safely. Has rendered valuable service on patrol duty, during which he was twice wounded. |
| 37147 | Serjeant ... | Barker, A. S. ... | 32nd Brigade Ammunition Column Royal Field Artillery | For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on 2nd November 1914, near Neuve Eglise, although wounded in both legs (one of which was broken early in the day) he continued serving his gun the whole day under heavy shell fire. An example in courage. |
| 6093 | Private ... | Barker, J. ... | 1st Battalion, East Lancashire Regiment | For conspicuous gallantry, ability, and general good work on numerous occasions, especially at Le Gheer on 17th January 1915, in voluntarily assisting another man in extinguishing a fire caused by German shells. This work was accomplished in full view of the enemy, under heavy rifle, machine-gun, and shell fire. He was previously employed in erecting wire entanglements every evening, 80 yards from the enemy. |
| 7789 | Private ... | Barlow, B. P. ... | 1st Battalion Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry | For conspicuous gallantry on the night of 9th-10th November 1914, in assisting two other men in the erection of a barbed wire fence 300 yards long, at a distance of only 40 yards from the enemy, whilst exposed to their fire. |
| 6745 | Acting-Serjeant | Barnes, H. V. ... | 2nd Battalion Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment | For gallantry and good work on reconnaissance duties near Frelinghein on 21st February 1915. |
| 9728 | Lance-Corporal | Barnes, W. ... | 1st Battalion, Royal Warwickshire Regiment | For gallant conduct on 18th September 1914, at La Montagne Farm, when the post occupied by him was wrecked by a shell and his two comrades wounded, he remained attending on them with great gallantry under very trying circumstances. |
| 11435 | Lance-Corporal | Barr, A. ... | 1st Battalion, Highland Light Infantry | For gallant conduct and devotion to duty between 19th and 22nd December 1914, and subsequently for assisting in the rescue of a wounded Officer under a heavy fire. The Officer was killed by a second bullet before he could be placed under cover. |
| 582 | Serjeant ... | Barrett, J. ... | Military Mounted Police | For gallantry and good example on 2nd November 1914, in controlling men under a heavy fire. Has performed good work throughout the campaign. |
| 7980 | Private ... | Batley, P. ... | 1st Battalion, Northamptonshire Regiment | For conspicuous gallantry on 22nd December 1914, near Bethune, when he picked up several bombs thrown into his trench and threw them back on the enemy. He was killed. |
