| 6832 | Corporal | Bird, J. R | 1st Battalion, Leices- tershire Regiment | For gallantry and ability on many occasions in obtaining valuable information relative to the enemy's position. Has been noted for his readiness to undertake patrol duty. |
| 60304 | Corporal | Bird, R. J | 12th Battery Royal Field Artillery | For gallant conduct on 25th October 1914, in joining his Battery Commander under very dangerous circumstances, and succeeding in keeping up communication by semaphore with his battery, under very heavy shell and rille fire. |
| 10755 | Private (Acting- Corporal) | Black, R | 1st Battalion High- land Light Infantry | For gallantry between 19th and 22nd December 1914, in working a bomb mortar uuder heavy fire, When ordered to return he remained to assist a wounded comrade. |
