Copy of a Letter from Rear-Admiral Dacres, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships at Jamaica, to William Marfden, Esq. dated Hercule, Port Royal, 26th July 1805.

SIR,

I herewith transmit, for their Lordships' information, the copy of a letter I have received from Lieutenant Fromow, commanding his Majesty's schooner Superieure, acquainting me of his having captured a very fast sailing Spanish felucca privateer that has much annoyed the trade of the island of Jamaica.

His Majesty's schooner Superieure, Wednesday 24th July 1805. The Morant Keys N. 3 deg. E. distant 45 miles.

SIR,

I have the honour to inform you, that his Majesty's schooner under my command, fell in with, and, after a chase of nine hours, going free, captured the Spanish felucca El Santa Maria Magdalena alias Son Sorito, commanded by Antonio Amet, armed with one gun and small arms, and manned with thirty men, has been cruising twenty days, and has only taken one droger.
