Copy of a Letter from the Hon. William Cornwallis, Admiral of the White, &c. to William Marsden, Esq. dated Ville de Paris, at sea, the 21st of October 1805.

I have the honour to inclose, for the information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a letter I have now received from Captain Lavie, of his Majesty's ship Iris, giving an account of his having fallen in with and captured the St Pedro Spanish corvette privateer, and recaptured the Magdalen, belonging to Greenock.

Iris, at fea, October 21. 1805. Sin,

I have the honour to acquaint you, that, at day-break on the 15th inft. being off Les Roche Bonnes, two fail were discovered steering towards Bourdeaux. It was soon ascertained that one was a schooner armed vessel, and the other a mer-chant ship, her prize. Though it blew strong on the shore. I was fortunate enough to cut off the ship. She proved to be the Magdalen of Greenock, who had separated from the Leeward Island convoy, and had been nearly a month in possession of the enemy.

On the same night a ship opened his fire upon me, and did not surrender until she had received several broadsides. She proved to be the St Pedro Spanish corvette privateer, mounting sixteen guns, eight of which are eighteen pounders, the rest Spanish six pounders, with one hundred and fifty men on board when she sailed, part of whom were distributed in sive vessels she had captured. I am forry to add, that we had one man killed, and the enemy two killed and four wounded. EXEMPTION FROM DUTY ON DIVIDENDS.

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Its Majesty's Commissioners for the Affairs of Taxes-hereby give Notice, that all persons claiming EXEMPTIONS from the DUTY, in respect of the DIVIDENDS arising from Annutice, Dividends of Shares of Annutices, out of any public Revenue, whether in the books of the Bank of England or of other public Companies, corporate or not corporate, belonging to any Friendly Societies, or to any Corporative Fraternity, or Society of Persons, established for charitable purposes only, are required to make their Claims to Exemption-before the Commissioners, for the special purposes of the acts; and that all such Claims must be made in writing, and delivered at the office for Taxes, in Somerset Place, directed to the Secretary for the Affairs of Taxes. The Form on which such Claims are to be made may be had at the faid office of the Luspector to the Duty upon Dividends, at the Old Stock Exchange, or to any Inspector or Surveyor of Taxes.
