

The Examinations are intended to supply the the several Post Offices with persons resident in or near the towns in which they desire to serve.

Candidates will be allowed to compete only for vacancies in the town in which they apply to be examined.

No person will be admitted to any of the above-named Examinations from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 13th January, an application on the prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Female Learner in London in the Department of the Postmaster-General.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 14 and 16. If an examination begins in one of the first four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of January in that year. If an examination begins in one of the second four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of May in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September of that year.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) That they are unmarried, or widows.
- (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.
- (c) That they are natural-born or naturalised British subjects.

3. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English.
2. History.
3. Geography.
4. Arithmetic.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in Handwriting and in the Examination as a whole.

5. No Candidate will be admitted to Examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by her Parent or Guardian, that she will, if successful, reside either with her parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.

6. Candidates must be at least five feet in height.

7. Persons who may have accepted a situation as Learner in any London office will not be

eligible to compete. Other persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the written permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

8. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of 4s. will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for situations as Female Learner in London in the Department of the Postmaster-General will be held in London on the 10th February 1916; under the foregoing Regulations.

Appointments will be offered to not fewer than 40 of the Candidates highest on the list, provided they obtain the necessary aggregate of marks and are duly qualified in other respects.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 13th January, an application on the prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
