The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Secretary for Scotland has, under the provisions of the Burial Grounds (Scotland) Act, 1855, as amended by the Secretary for Scotland Act, 1885, made a Representation that he has received a copy of an Interlocutor of the Sheriff-Substitute at Kilmarnock, dated the 15th day of December 1915, and made on a Petition of the Town Council of the Burgh of Saltcoats, in the County of Ayr, finding that the Old Burial Ground of the Parish of Ardrossan, situate within the said Burgh of Saltcoats, in the County of Ayr, and known as the Old Parish Churchyard, is dangerous to health, and offensive and contrary to decency:

And whereas in the said Representation it is recommended that the said Old Parish Church-yard should be closed forthwith in terms of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased to give Notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 23rd day of February next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order, or Notice thereof, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and that copies of this Order, or Notice thereof, be fixed as required by the above-mentioned Act on the doors of the Church of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before such Representation is so considered.

He showed great daring, when accompanied by only one officer and one man, in suddenly disarming 8 Germans in the presence of 20 German native troops drawn up under arms, all of whom were then marched off and held prisoners. Later he personally captured 5 armed natives.
