Copy of a letter from the Hon. Captain BLACKWOOD, of his Majesty's ship the Euryalus, to WILLIAM MARSDEN, Esq. dated this day at the Admiralty.

SIR,

Observing in the Gazette Extraordinary of the 27th inst. that the number of the enemy's ships taken and destroyed, in consequence of the action of the 21st of October, is stated at twenty sail of the line; I take the liberty of mentioning to you, for the information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that as this must be intended to include the French ship Argonaute, of 74 guns, which ship I had an opportunity of knowing was safe in the port of Cadiz, it will be proper to state the actual number taken and destroyed at nineteen sail of the line. This apparent inaccuracy was occasioned by the dispatch of the Commander in Chief, dated the 4th, having been made up before my last return with a flag of truce from that port. I am, &c.
