WHEREAS it is provided by Section 5 of the Midwives (Scotland) Act, 1916, that Rules framed by the Central Midwives Board for Scotland under the said Section shall be communicated to the General Medical Council, and shall be valid only if approved by the Privy Council, and that the Privy Council, before approving any such Rules, shall take into consideration any Representations which the General Medical Council may make with respect thereto :

And whereas the said Board, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section, have framed Rules, and have submitted the same to the Privy Council for approval :

Now, THEREFORE, Their Lordships, having taken the said Rules into consideration, and the General Medical Council having made no Representation with respect thereto, are pleased to approve the said Rules, as set forth in the Schedule hereto, for the period of five years from the date of this Order.

SCHEDULE.

CENTRAL MIDWIVES BOARD FOR SCOTLAND.

Rules framed under Section 5 (1) of the Midwives (Scotland) Act, 1915 (5 and 6 Geo. V. c. 91).

RULES A.—REGULATING THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

1. *Chairman and Deputy-Chairman.*—The Chairman and Deputy-Chairman shall be elected by ballot at the first ordinary meeting of the Board in the month of February in each year, and shall hold office until the first ordinary meeting in the month of February in the year following.

2. *Casual Vacancies.*—Should the office of Chairman or Deputy-Chairman fall vacant during the year, it shall be filled by election at the next ordinary meeting of the Board, and the member so elected shall hold office for the remainder of the year for which his predecessor was elected.

3. *Meetings.*—The Board shall meet in each month, unless otherwise decided at a previous meeting, on a day to be fixed to suit the convenience of its members, and at such other times as may be necessary. The Chairman may at any time convene a meeting of the Board, and the Secretary shall convene a meeting if required to do so by any three members of the Board by writing under their hands.

4. *Notice.*—Not less than four days' notice of any meeting shall be given to each member of the Board, directed to such address as he or she may from time to time furnish to the Secretary.

5. *Quorum.*—The quorum of the Board shall be four.

6. *Order of Business*.—The order of business shall be as follows:—

- (1) Minutes of the last meeting.
- (2) Notices of motion.
- (3) Reports of Committees.
- (4) Correspondence.
- (5) Business arising directly under the Act.
- (6) Statement of Accounts.
- (7) Bills and claims.
- (8) Any other competent business.
- (9) Date of next meeting.

Provided that the Board may at any meeting vary the order of business on the ground of urgency or convenience.

7. *Absence of Chairman and Deputy-Chairman*.—In the event of the Chairman and Deputy-Chairman not being present at any meeting of the Board, the Board shall elect a presiding Chairman for that meeting.

8. *Agenda*.—No business which is not upon the Agenda Paper shall be discussed at any meeting of the Board (except routine business) unless the Chairman shall declare such business to be of an urgent nature, and shall be supported by two-thirds of the members present and voting.

9. *Voting*.—Every question, the manner of voting on which is not otherwise specified in these rules, shall be decided on a show of hands by a majority of members present and voting, but any member may call for a division, in which case the names for and against shall be taken down in writing and entered on the Minutes. In the case of an equality of votes the presiding Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

10. *Motions*.—Every motion or amendment shall be moved and seconded, and handed to the Chairman in writing, and shall be read, before it is further discussed or put to the meeting.

11. *Notices of Motion*.—Every notice of motion shall be in writing, signed by the member giving the notice, and shall be given or sent to the Secretary, who shall insert in the Agenda Paper of the next ordinary meeting of the Board all notices of motion which he may have received not less than forty-eight hours prior to the day on which the Agenda Paper is sent out to members, in the order in which they have been received by him.

12. *Rescinding of Resolution*.—No resolution of the Board shall be altered or rescinded at a subsequent meeting except upon a notice of motion of which a copy has been sent out to members by the Secretary fourteen clear days before such meeting.

13. *Committees*.—There shall be the following Committees of the Board:—

- (1) A Standing Committee consisting of the whole Board. (The Quorum shall be four.)
- (2) A Penal Cases Committee. (The Quorum shall be three.)
- (3) A Finance Committee. (The Quorum shall be three.)

The two latter Committees shall be appointed annually at the first ordinary meeting in the month of February, and shall hold office until their successors are appointed. Other Committees may be appointed for special purposes from time to time.

Every Committee appointed by the Board shall make a report of its proceedings to the Board in writing, and the recommendations of every Committee shall, so far as practicable, be in the form of resolutions, to be considered by the Board; and the acts and proceedings of every Committee shall be submitted to the Board for approval, unless the resolution of the Board appointing the Committee shall otherwise direct in respect of all or any of the matters referred to it.

14. *Reports*.—Every report from a Committee shall be submitted by the Convener of the Committee (if present), who shall move that it be received by the Board, and on the motion being carried, the Convener, or any other member of the Committee, may move to agree with the resolutions of the Committee, and such resolutions shall be considered *seriatim*. The question that the report (if necessary, as amended) be now approved shall be put from the Chair, but no debate shall be allowed thereon.

15. *Bills and Claims*.—All bills and claims shall be examined by the Secretary and laid by him before the Finance Committee, who shall report them to the Board, and such bills and claims as are allowed shall be initialled by the presiding Chairman for payment.

16. *Cheques*.—All cheques for the payment of money shall be signed by two members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary.

17. *Financial Statement*.—At every Monthly Meeting of the Board the Secretary shall present a statement in writing showing the receipts and expenditure of the Board for the current year up to the date of such Meeting, and showing the existing balance, if any, to the credit of the Board.

18. *Decision of Chairman*.—The presiding Chairman shall decide upon any point of order or procedure, and his decision shall be final.

19. *Expenses of Members*.—The Scale of Expenses of members of the Board shall be such as may from time to time be recommended by the Central Midwives Board for Scotland, and approved by the Privy Council.

RULES B.—REGULATING THE ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES AND THE CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION TO THE ROLL OF MIDWIVES.

1. Candidates must satisfy the Board that they have reached a sufficient standard of general education, and submit the following documents, duly filled in and signed:—

- (a) A certificate of birth, or of baptism, or a statutory declaration made by a competent person, showing that the candidate is not under twenty-one years of age, and, where the candidate has been married, the certificate of marriage also;

- (b) Certificates to the effect that the candidate has undergone the training set forth in Rules C ;
- (c) A certificate of good moral character. This certificate must be in the form prescribed by the Board, and must be signed by two persons of position acceptable to the Board. Each person signing must state in the certificate that he or she has known the candidate for at least twelve months, and must append to his or her signature a statement of his or her calling or position and postal address. (Schedule, Form I.)

2. Candidates must pass an examination as hereinafter set forth. (See Rules C below.)

3. A candidate who has complied with the above requirements and has successfully passed the examination shall receive a certificate in the form set out in the Schedule, and her name shall be entered by the Secretary on the Roll of Midwives. (Schedule, Form II.)

4. The names of all women admitted to the Roll of Midwives under Sections 2, 11, and 14 of the Midwives (Scotland) Act, 1915, shall be printed in one single list and in alphabetical order.

RULES C.—REGULATING THE COURSE OF TRAINING, THE CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS, AND THE REMUNERATION OF THE EXAMINERS.

1. (1) No person shall, be admitted to an examination unless she produces certificates that she has, under supervision approved by the Board, undergone a course of training in midwifery extending over a period of not less than six months, comprising instruction in the subjects enumerated in Rule C 5 (Schedule, Form III. (a)), and including the following particular requirements:—

She shall, to the satisfaction of the person certifying, have

- (a) Attended and watched the progress of not fewer than twenty labours, making abdominal and vaginal examinations during the course of labour and personally delivering each patient. (Schedule, Form III. (b));
- (b) Nursed twenty lying-in women and their infants during the ten days following labour. (Schedule, Form III. (c));
- (c) Attended a course of not less than twenty lectures on the subjects enumerated in Rule C 5, extending over a period of not less than three months, and delivered by a Registered Medical Practitioner recognised by the Board as a lecturer. (Schedule, Form IV.)

(2) Provided that in the case of a woman who produces a certificate of

- (a) Three years' training as a nurse in a General Hospital approved by the Board; or,
- (b) Three years' training as a nurse in a Poor Law Institution recognised by the Local Government Board for Scotland as being a Training School for nurses and maintaining a Resident Physician or House Surgeon and a Matron or Superintendent Nurse; or,

(c) Enrolment as a Queen's Nurse by the Queen Victoria Jubilee Institute for Nurses, a period of not less than four months shall be substituted for the period of not less than six months stipulated above. (Schedule; Forms V. (a), (b), and (c).)

Provided also that in the case of a candidate from a General Hospital approved by the Board, whose course of training provides systematic instruction in certain of the subjects required for the certificate of the Board, a certificate from the Secretary of such Hospital to the effect that the candidate has undergone a course of nursing during a period of not less than three months in (a) a Children's Ward, or (b) a Gynæcological Ward, either of which shall be held to include a Ward in which new-born babies are received for treatment, shall exempt such candidate from one month's training. (Schedule, Form V. (d).)

Provided further in the case of a candidate from a Children's Hospital or Gynæcological Hospital, approved by the Board, a certificate from the Secretary of such Hospital to the effect that the candidate has undergone a course of six months' instruction in nursing in such an Hospital shall exempt such candidate from one of the six months' training. (Schedule, Form V. (e).)

2. (1) The certificates required by Rule C 1 (1) must be in the form prescribed by the Board, and must be filled up and signed either

- (a) By a Registered Medical Practitioner approved by the Board for the purpose; or,
- (b) By the Chief Midwife, or, in the absence of such an officer, by the Matron of an Institution recognised by the Board, being a Midwife certified under the Midwives (Scotland) Act; or,
- (c) In the case of a Poor Law Institution by the Chief Medical Officer, or the Matron, being a Midwife certified under the Midwives (Scotland) Act, or a Superintendent Nurse, certified in like manner and attached to such an Institution; or,
- (d) By a Midwife certified under the Midwives (Scotland) Act and approved by the Board for the purpose. (Schedule, Forms III. (a), (b), and (c).)

(2) The certificate required by Rule C 1 (1) (c) must be in the form prescribed by the Board, and must be filled up and signed by the person who has delivered the course of lectures. (Schedule, Form IV.)

(3) The certificates required by Rule C 1 (2) must be in the form prescribed by the Board, and must be filled up and signed by the Secretary of the Hospital or Institution; or by the Clerk to the Governing Authority of the Poor Law Institution at which the candidate has been trained; or by the Secretary of the Queen Victoria Jubilee Institute for Nurses. (Schedule, Forms V. (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e).)

3. Candidates who intend to present themselves for examination must send notice to the Secretary of the Board at least four weeks before the date fixed for the examination to commence, accompanied by the certificates mentioned in Rules B 1 and C 2, and by a fee of one guinea, or, in the event of the candidate having presented herself on a former occasion and having failed to pass, a fee of fifteen shillings. The certificates required by Rule 1 (1) (see Schedule, Forms III. (a), (b), and (c)) may be sent to the Secretary at the same time or at any subsequent date not being less than one week before the day fixed for the next examination. Until these certificates have been duly received and

accepted by the Board, a candidate shall not be deemed to have entered for the examination, but the fee if sent in previously shall not be returnable. In the event of a candidate being prevented by illness from attending or completing her examination after having paid the fee and having been accepted as eligible, she shall, subject to any special circumstances which, in the opinion of the Board, render her unfit, be admitted to a subsequent examination on payment of a fee of ten shillings and sixpence. In order to avail herself of this provision the candidate must produce a medical certificate satisfactory to the Board.

4. The Secretary shall send to each candidate accepted for the examination, to the address furnished by her for the purpose, a card of admission to the Written Examination, and shall personally or by deputy hand to each candidate attending the Written Examination a card of admission to the Oral Examination. Any candidate presenting herself at either examination without her card of admission shall be liable to exclusion.

5. The examination shall be partly oral and practical, and partly written, and shall embrace the following subjects:—

- (a) The elementary anatomy and physiology of the female pelvis and its organs, and a knowledge of the foetal head and placenta from an obstetrical point of view.
- (b) Pregnancy.
 - (1) Its hygiene;
 - (2) Its diseases and complications, including abortion;
- (c) The symptoms, mechanism, course and management of natural labour.
- (d) The signs that a labour is abnormal.
- (e) Hæmorrhage: its varieties and the treatment of each.
- (f) Antiseptics in Midwifery and the way to prepare and use them.
- (g) The management of the puerperal patient, including the use of the clinical thermometer and of the catheter, and the taking of the pulse.
- (h) The management (including the feeding) of infants.
- (i) Signs of the diseases which may develop during the first ten days, including Pemphigus and other skin eruptions.
- (j) The duties of the Midwife as described in the regulations.
- (k) Obstetric emergencies, and how the Midwife should deal with them until the arrival of a doctor. This will include some knowledge of the drugs commonly needed in such cases, and of the mode of their administration. (See Rules E 19 (a).)
- (l) Puerperal Fevers, their nature, causes and symptoms.
- (m) The Venereal Diseases (Syphilis and Gonorrhœa) in relation to their signs, symptoms, and dangers in women and children and to the risks of contagion to others.
- (n) The disinfection of person, clothing, and appliances.
- (o) Elementary physiology, and the principles of hygiene and sanitation as regards home, food, and person.
- (p) The care of children born apparently lifeless.

6. Due public notice shall be given of the examinations to be held under the Act.

7. The scale of remuneration of the examiners shall be such as may from time to time be recommended by the Central Midwives Board for Scotland, and approved by the Privy Council.

RULES D.—REGULATING THE ADMISSION TO THE ROLL OF WOMEN ALREADY IN PRACTICE AS MIDWIVES AT THE PASSING OF THE ACT.

1. Applications for admission to the Roll of Midwives under Sections 2 and 11 of the Midwives (Scotland) Act, 1915, must be made on the prescribed forms (Schedule, Forms VI., VIII.), and must be forwarded to the Central Midwives Board for Scotland together with such one or more of the following certificates as may be required.

2. In the case of women claiming admission on the ground of having obtained a certificate in Midwifery from the Royal Maternity Hospital of Edinburgh, the Royal Maternity Hospital, Glasgow, the Maternity Hospital, Aberdeen, the Maternity Hospital, Dundee, the Obstetrical Society of London, the Royal College of Physicians of Ireland, the Coombe Lying-in Hospital and Guinness's Dispensary, the Rotunda Hospital for the Relief of Poor Lying-in Women of Dublin, the National Maternity Hospital, Dublin, or the Central Midwives Board for England, (a) either the original certificate on which the application is based, or in the event of the original certificate having been lost, a voucher from the accredited Secretary or other agent of the certifying body to the effect that a certificate was granted to the applicant on such and such a date; and (b) a certificate signed by a Justice of the Peace, minister of religion, or registered medical practitioner, or the Secretary of an Institution (approved by the Central Midwives Board for Scotland) of which the applicant is a member, or is or was an employee, stating that the applicant is the person to whom the aforementioned certificate in Midwifery was granted. The Secretary of the Board shall, by comparison of the handwriting, or by such enquiry as he may think necessary, satisfy himself as far as possible of the applicant's identity. The application must be accompanied by a fee of ten shillings.

3. In the case of women claiming admission on the ground of having obtained a certificate of Midwifery from any Institution or Examining Body other than those specified in Section 2 of the Midwives (Scotland) Act, 1915, the certificate on which the application is based, together with satisfactory evidence, in the form prescribed by the Central Midwives Board for Scotland (Schedule, Form VII.), to the effect that before the certificate was granted the applicant had received a proper course of instruction and training (including personal attendance, under competent supervision, upon at least twenty cases during and after labour), and had passed an examination in Midwifery and the duties of a Midwife, and that the Institution or Examining Body by which the certificate was granted considers

the applicant at the present time to be a proper person to be admitted to the Midwives Roll. The application must be accompanied by a fee of ten shillings.

The applicant may be required to furnish other documents or particulars to enable the Board to decide whether the application can be granted.

4. In the case of women claiming admission on the ground of having been in *bonâ fide* practice as Midwives for twelve months previous to the 1st January 1916, a certificate to the effect that the applicant has to the personal knowledge of the person signing been in *bonâ fide* practice as a Midwife, for at least twelve months prior to the 1st January 1916, and that she is trustworthy, sober, and of good moral character. This certificate must be in the form given in the Schedule (Form IX.), must be signed by a Justice of the Peace, minister of religion, registered medical practitioner, or other person acceptable to the Board, and must be accompanied by a fee of ten shillings.

5. The certificates to be issued by the Board under Sections 2 and 11 will be in the prescribed forms (Schedule, Forms X., XI.).

NOTE.—Applications for admission to the Roll of Midwives under Section 2 of the Midwives (Scotland) Act, 1915, should be lodged not later than 31st December 1917.

RULES E.—REGULATING, SUPERVISING, AND RESTRICTING WITHIN DUE LIMITS THE PRACTICE OF MIDWIVES.

DIRECTIONS TO MIDWIVES concerning their Person, Instruments, &c.; their Duties to Patient and Child; and their Obligations with regard to Disinfection, Medical Assistance, and Notification.

1. (a) When engaged to attend a labour the midwife must interview her patient at the earliest opportunity to inquire as to the course of the previous pregnancies, confinements, and puerperia, both as regards mother and child, and to advise as to personal and general arrangements for the confinement, and, with the consent of the patient, visit the house.

NOTE.—Local Authorities now provide Health Visitors, Maternity Centres, or Child Welfare Centres for the assistance of the mother before and after the birth of the child. The midwife should advise the patient to avail herself of such help.

(b) Whenever illness or abnormality has occurred in the previous pregnancy, and whenever the previous pregnancy has ended in an abortion, a premature labour, or a still-birth, the midwife, on being engaged to attend the patient in her next confinement, should explain that the case is one in which skilled medical advice is required, and should urge the patient to seek advice from her medical attendant, or at a hospital or other suitable institution.

2. The midwife must be scrupulously clean in every way, including her person, clothing, appliances, and house; she must keep her nails cut short, and preserve the skin of her hands as far as possible from cracks and abrasions.

NOTE.—Unless the cleansing process be thoroughly carried out there will be, even after a healthy confinement, remains of blood, lochia, or liquor amnii on the fingers, and especially under the nails, which will there undergo decomposition, and so become dangerous to the next patient attended.

When attending to her patients she must wear a clean dress of washable material that can be boiled, such as linen, cotton, &c., and over it a clean washable apron or overall.

The sleeves of the dress must be made so that the midwife can tuck them up well above the elbows.

For list of appliances see Rule 3.

3. When called to a confinement a midwife must take with her in a metal case or in a bag or basket kept for that purpose only and furnished with a removable lining which can be disinfected:—

(a) An appliance for giving vaginal injections, a different appliance for giving enemata, a catheter, a pair of scissors, a clinical thermometer, and a nail-brush.

The Local Supervising Authority may, in the case of untrained midwives, use its discretion with regard to insisting upon the carrying of a catheter and appliances for giving vaginal injections.

(b) An efficient antiseptic or efficient antiseptics for such purposes as

- (1) Disinfecting the hands.
- (2) Douching in special cases.
- (3) Cleansing the infant's eyelids.

4. Before touching the generative organs or their neighbourhood the midwife must on each occasion disinfect her hands and forearms.

5. All instruments and other appliances must be disinfected, preferably by boiling, before being brought into contact with the patient's generative organs.

*6. Whenever a midwife has been in attendance, whether as a midwife or as a nurse, upon a patient, or in contact with a person suffering from puerperal fevers or from any other condition supposed to be infectious, or is herself liable to be a source of infection, she must notify the Local Supervising Authority of the fact, must (unless the Authority relieve her from that obligation) disinfect herself and all her instruments and other appliances, and have her clothing thoroughly disinfected, to the satisfaction of the Local Supervising Authority before going to any other maternity patient. (See Rule 22, 1 (e) and Rule 23, Form (e).)

Unless otherwise directed by the Local Supervising Authority, all washable clothing must be boiled, and other clothing must be sent to be disinfected by the Local Authority.

NOTE.—The Local Authority under the Public Health Acts is the Local Supervising Authority.

Duties to Patient.

7. A midwife in charge of a case of labour must not leave the patient without giving an address by which she can be found without delay; and, after the commencement of the Second Stage, she must stay with the woman until the expulsion of the placenta and membranes, and as long after as may be necessary. In cases where a doctor has been sent for on account of the labour being abnormal or of there being threatened danger (see Rule 20), she must await his arrival and faithfully carry out his instructions.

If for any reason the services of a Registered Medical Practitioner be not available, the midwife must, if the case be one of emergency, remain with the patient and do her best for her until the emergency is over.

After having complied with the Rule as to the summoning of medical assistance, the midwife will not incur any legal liability by remaining on duty and doing her best for her patient.

8. The midwife must wash the patient's external parts with soap and water, and then swab them with an efficient antiseptic solution on the following occasions:—

- (a) Before making the first internal examination;
- (b) After the termination of labour;
- (c) During the lying-in period when washing is required;
- (d) Before passing a catheter.

The Swabbing with antiseptic solution must be repeated before each further examination and before a douche is given. For this purpose the midwife must on no account use ordinary sponges or flannels, but material that has been boiled or otherwise disinfected before use.

*9. No more internal examinations should be made than are absolutely necessary.

10. The midwife in charge must in all cases of labour examine the placenta and membranes before they are destroyed, and must satisfy herself that they are completely removed.

11. The midwife must remove soiled linen, blood, fæces, urine, placenta, and membranes from the neighbourhood of the patient and from the lying-in room as soon as possible after the labour, and in every case before she leaves the patient's house.

†12. The midwife shall be responsible for the cleanliness, and shall give all necessary directions for securing the comfort and proper dieting, of the mother and child during the lying-in period, which shall be held, for the purpose of these regulations, and in a normal case, to mean the time occupied by the labour and a period of ten days thereafter.

Should the midwife for any reason continue her attendance after the tenth day the fact must be noted in her Register, with the explanation of the reason.

If after ceasing to attend a case the midwife is again called in to an illness of the mother or the child connected with the confinement, Rules 20, 21, 22, and 23 shall apply.

NOTE.—Local Authorities now provide Health Visitors, Maternity Centres, or Child Welfare Centres for the assistance of the mother before and after the birth of the child. The midwife should advise the patient to avail herself of such help.

13. A case of normal labour in these regulations shall mean a labour in which there are none of the conditions specified in Rule 21.

14. The midwife shall take and record the pulse and temperature of the patient at each visit, entering her records in a notebook or on charts, which must be carefully preserved.

Duties to Child.

15. In the case of a child born apparently dead the midwife must carry out the methods of resuscitation which have been taught her.

16. As soon as the child's head is born, and if possible before the eyes are opened, its eyelids must be carefully cleansed.

17. On the birth of a child which is in danger of death, the midwife shall inform the relatives or other responsible person.

General.

18. No midwife shall lay out a dead body except in the case of a patient upon whom she has been in attendance at the time of death.

After laying out a dead body for burial she must notify the Local Supervising Authority and undergo adequate cleansing and disinfection in accordance with Rule 6.

19 (a) A midwife must note in her Register of Cases each occasion on which she is under the necessity of administering in any way any drug other than a simple aperient, the name and dose of the drug and the time and cause of its administration. (See Rule 24, *Note*.)

(b) A midwife must report forthwith to the medical officer to the Local Supervising Authority each case in which she advises a mother to substitute artificial feeding for breast feeding. The midwife should endeavour to promote breast feeding or urge medical advice to be taken.

Conditions in which Medical Assistance must be sent for.

*20. In all cases of illness of the patient or child, or of any abnormality occurring during pregnancy, labour, or lying-in, a midwife, as soon as she becomes aware thereof, must explain that the

case is one in which the attendance of a Registered Medical Practitioner is required, and must hand to the husband or the nearest relative or friend present the form of sending for medical assistance (see Rule 23 (a)), properly filled up and signed by her, in order that this may be immediately forwarded to the Medical Practitioner or approved Institution.

*21. The foregoing Rule shall particularly apply :—

- (1) In all cases in which a woman during *Pregnancy*, *Labour*, or *Lying-in* appears to be dying or is dead.

Pregnancy.

- (2) In the case of a *Pregnant* woman, when there is any abnormality or complication, such as—
 Deformity or stunted growth,
 Loss of blood,
 Abortion or threatened abortion,
 Excessive sickness,

- (3) In the case of a woman in *Labour* at or near term, when there is any abnormality or complication, such as—

 Presentation other than the uncomplicated head or breech,
 Where no presentation can be made out,
 Where there is excessive bleeding,
 Where two hours after the birth of the child the placenta and membranes have not been completely expelled,
 In cases of serious rupture of the perinæum, or of other injuries of the soft parts.

Lying-in.

- (4) In the case of a *Lying-in* woman when there is any abnormality or complication, such as—
 Fits or convulsions,
 Abdominal swelling and tenderness,
 Offensive lochia, if persistent,
 Rigor, with raised temperature,
 Rise of temperature above 100° F. with quickening of the pulse for more than twenty-four hours,
 Unusual swelling of the breasts with local tenderness or pain,
 Secondary post-partum hæmorrhage,

The Child.

- (5) In the case of the *Child*, when there is any abnormality or complication, such as—
 Injuries received during birth,
 Any malformation or deformity endangering the child's life,
 Dangerous feebleness,
 † Inflammation of, or discharge from, the eyes, however slight,
 Serious skin eruptions, especially those marked by the formation of watery blisters,
 Inflammation about, or hæmorrhage from, the navel.

NOTIFICATION to the Local Supervising Authority.

*22. (1) The midwife must, as soon as possible, send notice on the prescribed form to the Local Supervising Authority, in accordance with Rule 23, in the following cases :—

*(a) *Medical Assistance.*—Whenever under Rule 20 the advice of a Registered Medical Practitioner has been sought.

*(b) *Deaths.*—In all cases in which the death of the mother or of the child occurs before the attendance of a Registered Medical Practitioner.

* See Rule 26.

† NOTE.—In cases where the eyes are affected the duties of the midwife are :—

- (1) Immediately to advise medical assistance.
 (2) To fill up and hand to the nearest relative or friend, the form for medical assistance. (See Rules E 20 and 23 (a).)
 (3) To send notice to the Local Supervising Authority that medical assistance has been sought. (See Rules E 22 (1) (a), and 23 (a).)
 (4) Also when there is a *purulent* discharge commencing within 21 days from the date of birth and medical assistance has *not* been obtained for this discharge, to notify the Local Authority. (See Rule E 6, *Note*.)

*(c) *Still-births*.—In all cases of still-birth where a Registered Medical Practitioner is not in attendance at the time of birth.

NOTE.—A child is deemed to be still-born when after being completely born it has not breathed or shown any sign of life. (See Rule 15).

In Scotland the term *still-birth* has hitherto been regarded as equivalent to *apparently dead*, but to secure uniformity with the English practice the Scottish Board will regard the terms *dead-born* and *still-born* as meaning the same thing.

*(d) *Laying out the dead*.—In all cases in which she has prepared, or assisted to prepare, a dead body for burial. (See Rule 18.)

*(e) *Liability to be a source of infection*.—Whenever a midwife has been in attendance, whether as a midwife or as a nurse, upon a patient, or in contact with a person, suffering from puerperal fevers or from any other condition supposed to be infectious, or is herself liable to be a source of infection. (See Rule E 6, and Rule E 23, Form (e).)

(2) *Change of name or address*.—All midwives, whether practising or not, must immediately notify the Local Supervising Authority of any change of name or address.

Note.—*Intention to practise*.—Notice of intention to practise must be given in accordance with Section 18 of the Midwives (Scotland) Act, 1915. (Form XII.)

The Local Supervising Authority shall make arrangements to secure a proper inspection of the Register of cases, bag of appliances, &c., of every Midwife practising in the district of such Authority, and, when thought necessary, an inspection of her place of residence, and an investigation of her mode of practice. The midwife shall give every reasonable facility for such inspection.

26. The rules or parts of rules in these Rules (*E*) which are marked with an asterisk shall not apply to Midwives exercising their calling under the supervision of a duly appointed medical officer within Hospitals approved by the Central Midwives Board for Scotland. ‡

27. Nothing in these Rules (*E*) shall apply to certified Midwives exercising their calling in Poor Law Institutions under the supervision of a duly appointed medical officer.

28. The proper designation of a certified Midwife is "Certified Midwife," thus, *e.g.* :—

No abbreviation in the form of initial letters is recognised, nor any other description of the qualification.

Provided that a Midwife whose name has been admitted to the Roll in virtue of having passed the Examination of the Central Midwives Board for Scotland or in virtue of a qualification under Section 2 of the Midwives (Scotland) Act, 1915, acquired by passing an Examination in Midwifery, may add the words "by Examination" after the words Certified Midwife.

RULES F.—DECIDING THE CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH MIDWIVES MAY BE SUSPENDED FROM PRACTICE.

1. In carrying out Section 16 (3) of the Midwives (Scotland) Act it shall be the duty of the Local Supervising Authority to suspend a Midwife from practice when necessary for the purpose of preventing the spread of infection, whether she has contravened any of the rules laid down by the Board or not, and in the exercise of that duty the Local Supervising Authority shall, after communicating their decision in writing to the Midwife concerned, at once report any suspension (with the grounds thereof) to the Board.

2. The period of suspension under the foregoing rule shall not be longer than is required by the Midwife for the purpose of disinfecting herself, her clothing, and her appliances to the satisfaction of the Local Supervising Authority; and if the period is expected to or does in fact last for more than 24 hours, that Authority shall forthwith communicate to the Board the special circumstances in which the prolonged suspension arises, and the matter shall be subject to revision by the Board.

RULES G.—DEFINING THE PARTICULARS REQUIRED TO BE GIVEN IN ANY NOTICE UNDER SECTION 18 OF THE ACT.

Notification of Practice.

The particulars required on the prescribed Form (Schedule, Form XII.) under Section 18 of the Midwives (Scotland) Act, 1915, shall be as follows:—

* If any drug, other than a simple aperient, has been administered in any way, state here the name and dose of the drug and the time and cause of its administration. (See Rule 19.)

‡ These Rules are Nos. 6, 12, 20, 21, 22 (1), 23, and 25.

- (1) Her Christian name and surname in full, and if married since the granting of her certificate the name under which it was formerly granted to her.
- (2) The number and date of the certificate granted by the Board to the person giving the notice.
- (3) Her usual place of residence; and, if she carries on her practice at another address, that address also.
- (4) If at any time she practises or acts as a Midwife outside the area within which she usually resides or carries on her practice, the dates and addresses at which she so practised or acted.

RULES H.—RULES OF PROCEDURE ON THE REMOVAL OF A NAME FROM THE ROLL, AND ON THE RESTORATION TO THE ROLL OF A NAME REMOVED.

Removal of a Name from the Roll.

In order to prevent any misapprehension on the subject it is desirable to point out that under the procedure laid down in these Rules, the prosecutor is "the Secretary, or other person appointed by the Board for the purpose" (Rule 10), and not the Local Supervising Authority which has reported the Midwife to the Board. The Medical Officer of Health or Inspector of Midwives in giving evidence appears therefore as a witness called by the Secretary as Prosecutor, and not as a Prosecutor.

1. When it is reported to, or otherwise brought to the attention of, the Board, that a Midwife has been convicted of a felony, misdemeanour, or offence, or has been guilty of disobeying the rules and regulations laid down under the Midwives (Scotland) Act, 1915, or of other misconduct, the Secretary shall, when investigation by the Local Supervising Authority is required, forthwith communicate such report or information to the Local Supervising Authority of the area within which the Midwife resides, or of that in which the felony, misdemeanour, offence, act of disobedience of the rules and regulations, or other misconduct is alleged to have been committed. He shall also ask such Authority to investigate the matter, and to report whether or not, in their opinion, a *prima facie* case of malpractice, negligence, or misconduct has been established against the Midwife.

2. Any report by a Local Supervising Authority shall, as soon as may be after its receipt by the Secretary, be laid, with all other information relating to the case to which it refers, before the Penal Cases Committee, who shall report thereon to the Board, and upon such report the Board shall proceed to consider whether such a case has in their opinion been made out so as to require an answer from the accused person.

3. If within a reasonable time after the making of a request for investigation of any case no report has been received from the Local Supervising Authority, the Penal Cases Committee shall report to the Board on the case without further delay, or after such special investigation by a Solicitor appointed by the Board as they may think necessary. The Committee may, if they think fit, take the advice of a Solicitor at any time on a case before them, and may instruct the Solicitor to obtain proofs of evidence in support of the allegations against the accused person. The Committee may, before reporting on any case to the Board, ask the accused person for any explanation she may have to offer, and may consider such explanation and report thereon to the Board.

4. If the Penal Cases Committee resolve that a case is one upon which proceedings ought to be commenced for the removal of a name from the Roll and the cancelling of a certificate, the Secretary shall direct the Solicitor to take all necessary steps for verifying the evidence to be submitted to the Board, and for obtaining the necessary documents and the attendance of witnesses. Any answer, evidence, or statement forwarded, or application made, by the accused person between the date of the issue of the notice hereunder mentioned and the day named for the hearing of the case by the Board shall be dealt with by the Secretary, in such manner as he may think fit, or may be referred by him to the Committee.

5. All statements in the nature of evidence proposed to be relied on as part of the case against the accused person, except proofs of convictions verified by the officer of a duly constituted Court, which cannot be laid before the Board by oral evidence, shall be verified by statutory declaration. A copy of any such statutory declaration or certificate of conviction shall be supplied free of cost to the accused person before the day fixed for the meeting of the Board to deal with the case, or for the adjournment thereof.

A copy of any defence in writing by an accused Midwife shall be sent to the Local Supervising Authority before the hearing of the case if practicable.

6. If the Board decide that such case has been made out, proceedings for the removal of a name from the Roll or the cancelling of a certificate shall be commenced by the issue of a notice in writing, addressed to the accused person by the Secretary, on behalf of the Board. Such notice shall specify the nature and particulars of the charge alleged against the accused person, and shall inform her of the day on which the Board intend to deal with the case and decide upon the said charge. The notice shall further require the accused person to forward her certificate, register of cases, and pulse and temperature record to the Secretary seven days before the hearing of the case, to answer in writing the charges brought against her, and to attend before the Board on such day.

7. The notice, accompanied by a copy of these Rules, shall be sent by registered letter to the last-known address or the enrolled address of the accused person, and shall be so sent as to allow at least twenty-one days between the day on which the notice is issued and the day appointed for the hearing of the case by the Board.

8. The case shall be heard at a special meeting of the Board, of which at least seven days' notice shall be sent by the Secretary to each member and to the Local Supervising Authority, who shall be given the opportunity to attend and assist the Secretary. The accused person may be represented or assisted by a friend, legal or otherwise, provided that seven days' notice of the intention of such representative to appear on behalf of the accused shall have been received by the Secretary.*

9. When in the course of proceedings for the removal of a Name from the Roll charges are made against a Local Supervising Authority or any of its officers, to which an answer may be reasonably expected, such an Authority or officer shall in each case be entitled to appear and be heard at the hearing of the case.

10. At the hearing of the case the Secretary, or other person appointed by the Board for the purpose, shall first state to the Board the facts of the case and the charge alleged against the accused person, and shall then submit to the Board the evidence which he has received in support of the charge. The accused person, or her representative, shall be entitled to cross-examine any witness appearing against her on matters relevant to the charge.

11. When the evidence in support of the charge and a statement by or on behalf of the person making the charge are concluded, the accused person, or her representative, shall be invited by the Chairman to address the Board, and to tender evidence in answer to the charge.

12. If the accused person does not attend as required, either personally or by representative, the Board may proceed to hear and decide upon the charges in her absence.

13. Upon the conclusion of the whole case the Board shall deliberate thereon, and shall, after due consideration of all the relevant evidence on either side, whether oral or documentary, pronounce its decision either forthwith or at a subsequent meeting.

14. If the Board find the charges against the accused person to be proved either in whole or in part, and the offence cannot, in its opinion, be adequately dealt with by censure or caution, the Board may direct the Secretary to remove the name of the accused person from the Roll of Midwives and to cancel her certificate.

15. Notice in writing, by registered letter, of the removal of the name from the roll and of the cancelling of the certificate shall be sent by the Secretary to the person found guilty of the offence, and to the Local Supervising Authority of the district within which she resides.

Restoration to the Roll of a Name Removed.

16. Application for restoration to the Roll shall be made in writing addressed to the Secretary of the Board, and signed by the applicant, stating the grounds on which application is made. In cases where the cancelled certificate has not already been returned to the Board, it shall be sent in with the application, or a statutory declaration made of its previous loss or destruction.

17. The application must be accompanied by a statutory declaration made by the applicant, setting forth the facts of the case and stating that she is the person originally enrolled. The declaration shall be in the Form given in the Schedule. (Form XIII.)

18. The statements in the application and declaration must also be supported by the certificate of the Local Supervising Authority of the district in which the applicant is resident, and by the certificates of at least two persons, being Justices of the Peace, Ministers of Religion, or Registered Medical Practitioners, who were and are well acquainted with the applicant before and since the removal of her name. These certificates must each of them testify to the applicant's identity and present good character, and they shall be in the Form given in the Schedule. (Form XIV.)

19. The application, when duly supported by the declaration and certificates as herein before provided, shall be considered at a meeting of the Board, held specially for the purpose, of which at least seven days' notice shall be sent by the Secretary to each member. The Board may adjourn the consideration to a future date, or require further evidence or explanations from the applicant.

20. After consideration of all the circumstances of the case, as submitted to them in accordance with the provisions of these Rules, the Board may, if they think fit, direct the Secretary to restore the name of the applicant to the Roll of Midwives, and to issue a new certificate to her, on payment of the fee of 10s.

21. A copy of these Rules and of the Forms prescribed in the Schedule shall be supplied by the Secretary to intending applicants on demand.

The following amended translation of the German ordinance of July 22nd, 1916, is issued to replace that published in the London Gazette of August 18 :—

GERMAN CONTRABAND OF WAR.

In further retaliation for the regulations adopted by England and her Allies, deviating from the London Declaration of Maritime Law of February 26, 1909, I approve for the present war of the following alterations of the Prize Ordinance of September 30, 1909, and of its supplements, dated October 18, November 23 and December 14, 1914, of April 18, 1915, and June 3, 1916.

Articles 21, 23, 27, 30 and 33, and the additions to Articles 23, shall be replaced by the following provisions :

21. *The following articles and materials, designated absolute contraband, shall be considered contraband of war :*

(1) Arms of all kinds, including arms for sporting purposes, their component parts as well as semi-manufactured articles which can be used in their manufacture.

(2) Projectiles, cartouches and cartridges of all kinds, their competent parts as well as semi-manufactured articles which can be used for their manufacture.

(3) Powder and explosives of all kinds, smoke-producing and illuminating substances, incendiary matter, implements and substances for fighting with gas, and materials which can be used for their manufacture, including:—Nitric acid and nitrates of all kinds ; ammonia, ammonia liquor, ammonium chloride, ammonium salts ; sulphur, sulphur dioxide, sulphuric acid, fuming sulphuric acid (oleum), carbon bisulphide ; acetic acid, acetates, for example, acetate of calcium ; acetic ether, formic ether, sulphuric ether ; acetone ; ethyl and methyl alcohol (spirit), for example, sulphite spirit ; urea ; resinous products, camphor and turpentine (oil and spirit) ; carbide of calcium ; cyanamide ; sodium cyanide ; phosphorus and its compounds ; chlorates and perchlorates of sodium, barium and calcium ; chlorine, chlorhydrin ; bromine ; phosgene (carbonyl-chloride) ; stannic chloride ; mercury ; pitch ; tar, including wood-tar, wood-tar oil ; benzol, toluol, xylol, solvent naphtha, phenol (carbolic acid), cresol, naphthalene and their mixtures and derivatives ; aniline and its derivatives ; glycerine ; dioxide of manganese ; arsenic and its compounds.

(4) Cannon barrels, gun mountings, limbers, munition wagons, field kitchens and bakeries, supply wagons, field forges, searchlights, searchlight accessories and their component parts.

(5) Range-finders and their component parts.

(6) Binoculars, telescopes, chronometers, nautical and artillery instruments of all kinds.

(7) Clothing and equipments of a recognisable military character.

(8) Saddle, draught and pack animals, suitable, at present or in the future, for use in war.

(9) All kinds of harness of a distinctively military character.

(10) Articles of camp equipment and their component parts.

(11) Armour plates.

(12) Steel and iron wire; barbed wire, as well as implements for fixing and cutting the same.

(13) Sheets, tinned or galvanised.

(14) Warships and other vessels of war, as well as component parts of such a nature that they can be used only on a vessel of war; ship plates and construction steel.

(15) Submarine sound-signalling apparatus.

(16) Airships and aeroplanes of all kinds and their component parts, together with accessories, articles and materials for use in connection with aerial navigation; goldbeaters' skin.

(17) Photographic articles.

(18) Tools and appliances designed exclusively for the manufacture and repair of arms and war material.

(19) Lathes, machinery and tools used in the manufacture of munitions of war.

(20) Electrical articles designed for use in war.

(21) Mining timber, including undressed and partly dressed timber for mining purposes, rattan, bamboo, cork, including cork flour.

(22) Coal and coke.

(23) Flax, hemp, jute, vegetable fibres and yarns made therefrom.

(24) Wool, raw, combings or cardings; wool waste, flocks of wool and wool combings; carded and combed woollen yarn; animal hair of all kinds, as well as flocks, combings and yarns made of animal hair.

(25) Raw cotton, linters, cotton waste, cotton yarns, cotton goods and other cotton products capable of being used in the manufacture of explosives.

(26) Barrels of all kinds and their component parts.

(27) Gold, silver, coined and in bars, paper money and all negotiable commercial documents and marketable securities.

(28) Rubber tyres for motor vehicles, as well as all articles and materials used specially in manufacturing or repairing rubber tyres.

(29) Rubber (including crude rubber, waste rubber, reclaimed rubber, rubber solution, rubber cement, or any other preparation containing rubber), balata and guttapercha, as well as the following kinds of rubber—viz., Borneo, Guayule, Jelutong, Palembang, and all other materials containing rubber; besides articles which are made in whole or in part of rubber.

(30) Mineral oils (including shale oils, petroleum, benzine, naphtha, gasoline).

(31) Lubricants.

(32) Tanning material of all kinds, including quebracho wood and the extracts used in tanning.

(33) Hides of cattle, buffaloes and horses; hides of calves, pigs, goats and wild animals; and leather, dressed or undressed, if suitable for use in saddlery, harness, military boots and military clothing; beltings, hydraulic leather and pump leather.

(34) The following ores—Tungsten ores (wolframite and scheelite), molybdenite, manganese ore, nickel ore, chrome ore, zinc ore, lead ore, hæmatite iron ore, pyrites (crude and calcined), copper ores.

(35) Aluminium, aluminium salts, calcined alumina, bauxite.

(36) Antimony, together with the sulphides and oxides of antimony.

(37) Felspar.

(38) The following metals—Tungsten, molybdenum, vanadium, nickel, selenium, cobalt, hæmatite pig-iron, manganese and its alloys, copper and its alloys, tin, lead.

(39) Alloys of iron (ferro compounds), including tungsten, manganese, vanadium and chrome iron.

23. *The following articles and materials suitable for warlike as well as for peaceful purposes, coming under the designation of conditional contraband, shall be considered as contraband of war:*

(1) Foodstuffs.

(2) Forage and all kinds of feeding stuffs for animals; oil seeds, nuts and kernels; animal, fish and vegetable oils and fats, excluding those suitable as lubricants, and not including volatile oils.

(3) The following articles, if suitable for use in war: articles of clothing, fabrics for clothing, boots and shoes, skins and furs which can be used for clothing, boots and shoes.

(4) Vehicles of all kinds and their component parts, as well as accessories (especially all motor vehicles), suitable for use in war.

(5) Railway materials, both fixed and rolling stock, and materials for telegraphs, wireless telegraphs and telephones.

(6) Fuel, exclusive of coals, coke and mineral oils.

(7) Horseshoes and shoeing materials.

(8) Harness and saddlery.

(9) Ships, boats and floating craft of all kinds, floating docks and appliances for dry docks, as well as their component parts.

(10) Cement.

(11) All kinds of timber, rough or worked (especially hewn, sawn, planed, grooved), excepting mining timber, etc. [See paragraph 21, under (21).]

27. *The following articles cannot be declared contraband of war:—*

(1) Raw silk.

(2) Resin, varnish, hops.

(3) Horns, bones and ivory.

(4) Natural and artificial fertilisers.

(5) Earths, lime, chalk, stones, including marble, bricks, slates and roofing tiles.

(6) Porcelain and glass.

(7) Paper and the materials prepared for its manufacture.

(8) Soap, colours, including the materials exclusively used for their manufacture, and varnish.

(9) Chloride of lime, soda, caustic soda, sulphate of soda in cakes, copper sulphate.

(10) Machinery specially adapted for agriculture, for textile industry, and for printing.

(11) Precious stones, semi-precious stones, pearls, mother of pearl and corals.

(12) Steeple and wall clocks, timepieces and watches, excepting chronometers.

- (13) Fashion and fancy goods.
 (14) Feathers of all kinds.
 (15) Articles of domestic furniture and decorative articles for domestic purposes; office furniture and appliances.

30. The *hostile destination* referred to in Article 29 is to be taken for granted—

(a) if the goods are destined to be unloaded in a hostile port or to be delivered to the hostile army forces;

(b) if the ship is to call only at hostile ports or if it is to call at a hostile port or to meet the armed forces of the enemy before reaching the neutral port to which the goods are consigned.

Without considering the port of destination of the ship, the hostile destination referred to in Article 29 is to be presumed, in the absence of conditions to the contrary, if the shipment is consigned—

(a) directly or indirectly to an enemy authority or the agent of such; or

(b) to order or to a consignee not specified in the ship's papers, or directly or indirectly to a person residing in territory belonging to or occupied by the enemy, or who during the present war has directly or indirectly supplied contraband goods to territory belonging to or occupied by the enemy, or to an enemy authority or the agent thereof.

33. In the absence of conditions to the contrary, the hostile destination referred to in No. 32 is to be presumed when—

(a) the goods are consigned to an enemy authority or the agent of such or to a dealer known to have supplied articles of the kind in question or products thereof to the armed forces or the administrative authorities of the enemy State;

(b) the goods are consigned to order or to a consignee not specified in the ship's papers or directly or indirectly to a person residing in territory belonging to or occupied by the enemy or who during the present war has directly or indirectly supplied contraband goods to territory belonging to or occupied by the enemy or to an enemy authority or the agent thereof;

(c) the goods are consigned directly or indirectly to a fortified place belonging to the enemy or to a place serving as a base of operations or supplies to the armed forces of the enemy.

Merchant vessels as such are not to be considered as destined for the armed forces or the administrative authorities of the enemy merely for the reason that they are on a voyage to one of the places referred to under letter (c).

This ordinance takes effect the day of its promulgation.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (MUNITION WORKERS) EXCLUSION ORDER.

Made by the Board of Trade, dated 29th August 1916.

WHEREAS by Section 1 (1) of the National Insurance (Part II.) (Munition Workers) Act, 1916, it is provided *inter alia* that subject to the provisions of that Act the provisions of the National Insurance Act, 1911, relating to unemployment insurance as amended by the National Insurance (Part II. Amendment) Act, 1914, and the National Insurance (Part II. Amendment) Act, 1915 (which provisions as so amended are therein and herein referred to as the principal Act), and the regulations made thereunder shall extend to every person being a worker within the meaning of the principal Act who is engaged on or in connection with munitions work as defined by the Munitions of War Acts, 1915 and 1916, except such classes of such work as the Board of Trade may by order exclude:

And whereas by Section 4 of the above-mentioned National Insurance (Part II.) (Munition Workers) Act, 1916, it is, amongst other things provided that nothing in that Act shall affect any workman in an insured trade within the meaning of the principal Act in respect of his employment in that trade:

Now therefore the Board of Trade by virtue of the power of exclusion conferred upon them as hereinbefore recited and of every other power them hereunto enabling do hereby order that the classes of munitions work specified in the Schedule hereto shall be excluded from the operation of Section 1 (1) of the National Insurance (Part II.) (Munition Workers) Act, 1916.
