

ADDITIONAL HONOURS AND COMMENDATIONS FOR SERVICE IN THE BATTLE OF JUTLAND.

CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

The KING has been graciously pleased to give Orders for the following appointment to the Most Honourable Order of the Bath in recognition of the services of the undermentioned Officer as Captain D. of a Destroyer Flo-tilla during the Battle of Jutland. The ap-pointment to date from the 31st May, 1916:—

The KING has been graciously pleased to give orders for the following appointments to the Distinguished Service Order and for the award of the Distinguished Service Cross to the undermentioned Officers in recognition of their services in the Battle of Jutland:—

*To be Companions of the Distinguished Service Order.*

Fleet Surg. Ernest Alfred Penfold, M.B., R.N.

Was in the fore medical distributing station when a heavy shell burst just outside, killing and wounding many. He was knocked down, bruised and shaken, but personally assisted in the removal of the wounded and tended them with unremitting skill and devotion for forty hours without rest. His example was invaluable in keeping up the morale of the wounded and of the medical party under very trying conditions, the shell having destroyed instruments, dressings, etc.

Cdr. John Coombe Hodgson, R.N.

Led Destroyer attack on enemy Battle Cruisers, but, becoming engaged with enemy Destroyers, was unable to get within range. On conclusion of gun attack, in which several hostile Destroyers were sunk and the enemy beaten off, he attacked enemy Battle Fleet and fired four torpedoes under very hot fire of enemy Battleships' secondary arma-ment. His Destroyer was struck and damaged by a shell.

Lieut.-Cdr. Evelyn Claude Ogilvie Thomson, R.N.

Senior Officer of a Division of Destroyers, and having defeated the enemy Destroyers, gallantly pressed home attack with torpedoes on enemy Battle Cruisers.

Capt. Harold Blount, R.M.A.

Performed excellent service as officer of "Q" Turret on 31st May, as well as in the action off Heligoland in August, 1914, and at the Dogger Bank in January, 1915.

*To receive the Distinguished Service Cross.*

Mr. Francis William Potter, Gunner, R.N.  
For very important duties during the action, carried out with great coolness and accuracy.

Mr. Thomas Bazley, Gunner (T), R.N.

Was of great assistance during action on night of 31st May-1st June. In charge of torpedo armament of ship, and fired at enemy's Battle Fleet during the night with effect.

The following awards have also been approved for service in the Battle of Jut-land:—

*To receive the Conspicuous Gallantry Medal.*

Col. Sergt. Abraham Spooner, R.M.A., No. R.M.A./4980.

Second in command of the Marine detach-ment of H.M.S. "Warrior." After his guns were no longer required, he showed the greatest gallantry and initiative in rescuing wounded in dense smoke and gas fumes from Marines' mess deck.

Ldg. Sto. Thomas McGovern, O.N.K. 5606 (Dev.).

Showed much courage in extinguishing a large fire, which could only be reached through a shell hole surrounded by intense heat, fumes and smoke. His behaviour was highly commendable.
