The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education in Scotland, by virtue and in pursuance of the powers in them vested under Section 14 of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, have made a Scheme amending the Superannuation Scheme for Teachers in Scotland, approved by His Majesty in Council on the 14th day of May 1912, as amended by Schemes approved by His Majesty in Council on the 12th day of August 1913 and the 12th day of August 1915:

And whereas the provisions of the said Act have been complied with, and the said amending Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament in accordance with the directions contained in the said Act:

And whereas neither House of Parliament has presented an Address praying His Majesty to withhold His consent from the said amending Scheme or any part thereof:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said amending Scheme (a copy whereof is hereunto annexed) into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve the same, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said amending Scheme do take effect as from the 1st day of April 1917.

> EDUCATION (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1908, SECTION 14.

AMENDMENT OF THE SUPERANNUATION SCHEME FOR TEACHERS.

Whereas by section 14, subsection (4), of the Education (Scotland) Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Scotch Education Department (hereinafter called "the Department") shall prepare a Superannuation Scheme applicable to such teachers as shall be prescribed therein, and by subsections (10), (11), and (12) of the said section certain procedure is prescribed with a view to the making of a scheme; and whereas by subsection (13) of the said section it is enacted that a scheme under the said section of the said recited Act may be amended by a subsequent scheme under the like procedure; and whereas on the first day of November 1911 the Department, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon them as aforesaid, and after due observance of the prescribed procedure, made a scheme for the superannuation of teachers (hereinafter called "the Scheme"), which Scheme was not made applicable to all teachers in certain institutions for the training of teachers; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient that the said Scheme as the same has been or may be amended from time to time should apply to the said teachers; now, therefore, the Department, in virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred upon them as aforesaid, do amend the Scheme by adding to it the following provisions:—

First.—The Scheme as amended from time to time shall, save as hereinafter provided, apply to all teachers who are employed by a Provincial Committee for the training of teachers established by the minute of the Department dated the thirtieth day of January one thousand nine hundred and five, or by the managers of any institution or part of an institution of which the main function is, in the opinion of the Department, the training of teachers, and whose service is recorded by the Department.

Second.—For the purposes of the Scheme "teachers" shall include directors of studies and lecturers, and the Department may record service as a teacher in a training centre conducted by a Provincial Committee, or in an institution or part of an institution as defined above; and "managers" shall include Provincial Committees and the managers of an institution or part of an institution as defined above.

Third.—The "date of commencement" shall be the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and seventeen in the case of teachers as aforesaid who are not at the said date contributors under the Scheme.

Provided that if any such teacher had previously been a contributor under the Scheme, but had ceased to have his service recorded without having his contributions returned to him, the period of service in respect of which he had made contributions shall, in ascertaining the amount of any retiring allowance to be paid to him, be reckoned as service after the date of commencement, and in respect of the period of

service during which he has ceased to be a contributor under the Scheme he shall have the option of paying arrears of contributions (subject to the arrears of Managers' contributions being also paid) up to the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, or of having this period of service reckoned as service for the purposes of Article 13 of the Scheme.

And whereas, further, it is desirable to amend Article 20 of the Scheme, it shall be read as if from the date of commencement it had been expressed in the following words, viz.:—

The return of contributions under the immediately preceding Article shall not include any contributions made in terms of the Elementary School Teachers (Superannuation) Act, 1898. Teachers who have made contributions under that Act and who are not in receipt of a disablement allowance under that Act or of a retiring allowance in terms of Article 10 hereof (as applied by Article 12 to the case of existing teachers) shall, on making application to the Department, when they have attained the age of sixty-five years, receive the deferred annuity represented by such contributions, in addition to the retiring allowance payable under this Scheme.

Provided that if a teacher in receipt of a retiring allowance under Article 10 (as applied by Article 12 to the case of existing teachers) attains the age of sixty-five years, any annuity which would otherwise be payable to him out of the deferred annuity fund shall, except where the allowance has ceased by reason of his being again employed in recorded service, be paid by the Treasury to the Education (Scotland) Fund.

There will, however, be no title to repayment of Income Tax in respect of such untaxed dividends.


