ADMIRALTY-OFFICE-Jan, 11. 1806. Copy of a letter from Sir Edward Pellew, Bart. Rear-Admiral of the Red, &c. to William Marfden, Efq. dated on board his Majesty's ship the Culloden, in Madras Roads, the 27th June 1805.

Sin, I forward, for the fatisfaction of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a letter from Licutenant Bell, acting commander of his Ma-jerty's floop Victor, dated Busheer, 23d May, announcing his having captured, and subsequently destroyed a small French privateer, named Les Amis Rennis, (alias Le Vingt Cinq). on the 7th ult. at the entrance of the Persian Gulph.

His Majefty's floop Victor, Busheer Road, May 23, 1805.
With pleasure I inform your Excellency, that his Majesty's ship Victor, under my command, in the 7th of this month, captured Les Amis Scunis, a French privateer of 50 tons, two long four pounders, and manned with thirty-eight men, just within the entrance of the Persian Gulph, the Coins bearing E. N. E. five or fix leagues; out 80 days from the Isle of France; had not taken any thing. I was prompted to testroy her by having the convoy in company, which arrived hither safe three days since.
