* Section 8 of the Corn Returns Act, 1882, provides that where returns of purchases of British Corn are made to the Local Inspector of Corn Returns in any other measure than the imperial bushel or by weight or by a weighed measure, that Officer shall convert such returns into the imperial bushel, and in the case of weight or weighed measure the conversion is to be made at the rate of sixty imperial pounds for every bushel of wheat, fifty imperial pounds for every bushel of barley, and thirty-nine imperial pounds for every bushel of oats.

INTIMATION is hereby given that on 20th June 1917 a Petition was presented to the Lords of Council and Session (Second Division, —Mr. Antonio, Clerk) under the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908, praying their Lordships to confirm an alteration of the Form of Constitution of the said Bank by the substitution of a Memorandum and Articles of Association for the original Contract of Copartnership of 1830, all as set forth in a Special Resolution of the Partners of the Bank passed on 25th April 1917, and confirmed on 16th May 1917. The said Special Resolution is as follows:—

“That the Memorandum and Articles of Association submitted to this Meeting, a printed copy of which has for the purposes of identification been docketed and subscribed by the Chairman of this Meeting, be, and the same are hereby approved, and that, pursuant to the provisions of the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908, Sections 9 and 264, the form of the Company's constitution be altered by substituting the said Memorandum and Articles of Association for the Company's Contract of Copartnership, dated 10th March 1830, and subsequent dates, as
