6. For the purposes of this Order Super-phosphate shall mean Superphosphate of Lime manufactured from Mineral Phosphate but shall not include Basic Superphosphate, Bone Superphosphate, Dissolved Bones, Bone Meal or Bone Compound, Guanos or Compound Manures.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

FURTHER ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE SCOT-LAND, EAST CENTRAL, AND THE SCOTLAND, WEST CENTRAL, AREAS.

Any person contravening the provisions of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

Whereas it appears to Us the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) that in order that the sale and supply of exciseable liquor may be controlled in the said areas the business carried on in licensed premises situate in the Burghs and Parishes hereinafter mentioned should be carried on subject to the supervision of the Board:

And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, we have duly appointed WILLIAM WHITEHEAD WINTON, of Newington, Annan, in the County of Dumfries, to supervise on our behalf the carrying on of the business in the said premises:

Now, therefore, We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following order :-

1. This Order shall apply to so much of the Scotland, East Central, Area as comprises the Parish of Granton in the County of the City of Edinburgh; the Parishes of Cramond and Kirkliston in the County of Midlothian; the Burghs of Queensferry, Linlithgow and Borrowstounness and the Parishes of Linkthgow, Borrowstounness and Carriden, Abercorn, Dalmeny, Cramond and Kirkliston in the County of West Lothian; and the Burghs of Culross, Inverkeithing, Dunfermline, Burgtisland and Kinghorn and the Parishes of Tulliallan, Culross, Torryburn, Inverkeithing, Carrock, Durfermline, Dalgety, Aberdour, Burntisland and King-
