2. Every holder of a licence for the sale of exciseable liquor in the said Burghs and Parishes shall carry on his business subject to the supervision of the said William Whitehead Winton appointed as aforesaid to act on behalf of the Board and shall permit and cause his servants and agents to permit the said William Whitehead Winton and his duly authorised agents to enter the licensed premises whenever required by the said William Whitehead Winton so to do and shall give any information which he may require in connection with the business carried on at such premises and shall obey abide by and carry out and cause his servants and agents to obey abide by and carry out all orders and directions which the said William Whitehead Winton may give in relation to the carrying on of the business in the said premises.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER (AMENDMENT) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE SCOTLAND, EAST CENTRAL, AND THE SCOTLAND, WEST CENTRAL, AREAS.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order shall apply to the Scotland, East Central, Area and to so much of the Scotland, West Central, Area as comprises the County of Stirling and all burghs within the geographical limits thereof.

2. Article 3 of the Order of the Board for the Scotland, East Central, Area, and of the Order of the Board for the Scotland, West Central, Area in so far as the same affects the said County and burghs, made respectively on the 12th day of August 1915, shall be amended by adding thereto the following paragraph:—

“Spirits to be consumed off the premises shall not be sold or supplied in or taken from any licensed premises or club in any vessel of a capacity less than one reputed quart, or in any less quantity than one reputed quart.”

And the said Article in each of the said Orders shall be read as if the foregoing paragraph were inserted therein.

3. The secretary of every club to which this Order applies and every holder of a licence for the sale of exciseable liquor shall keep permanently affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or

in each public room in the licensed premises a copy of this Order.

4. This Order shall come into force on the third day of September 1917.

RULES FOR THE ROYAL NAVAL CORDITE FACTORY, UNDER THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULA- TIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by Regulation 35A of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby make the following rules:—

Application.

1. These rules shall apply to any person employed or being in the Royal Naval Cordite Factory. The posting of these rules at the main gates shall be deemed to be notice of their contents to all concerned.

Smoking.

2. No person shall smoke within the Factory except as authorised by the Superintendent or in accordance with the Factory's General Rules.

Tobacco, Cigars, Cigarettes or Pipes.

3. No person shall bring into the Factory, or have in his possession therein, any Tobacco, Cigar, Cigarette or Pipe except as authorised by the Superintendent, or in accordance with the Factory's General Rules.

Matches and Prohibited Articles.

4. No person shall bring into the Factory matches, or other means of procuring a light or articles likely to cause fire or explosion, except as authorised by the Superintendent, or in accordance with the Factory's General Rules.

Searching.

5. Any Police Constable and anyone authorised by the Superintendent may search at any time any person entering or being within the Factory, and may examine such person's clothing and any bag, basket, parcel or other articles carried by him or her, and any person entering or being within the Factory shall, if so required by any such Police Constable or authorised person, submit to being searched and comply with any reasonable directions or regulations given or made with the object of enabling the search to be carried out, provided that in no case shall any female person be searched by, or in the presence of anyone, but a female person.

Intoxication.

6. No person in a state of intoxication shall be, or shall be allowed to enter or to remain,
