She proves to be Le Sorcier, of and from St Maloes; with 60 men and 14 guns, ten of which they had thrown overboard during the chace, commanded by Guillaume Francoise Neele; out two days, and had taken nothing, but was to crusse for two months. I feel pleased that two such vessels should fall into our possession, as they might have done much mischief to our western commerce.
