Harbour, Feb. 5, 1806.

Sir.—His Majesty's ship Druid arrived here early this morning; and I have the pleasure to inclose, for their Lordships' information, copy of a letter, dated at fea the 2d ink. from Capt. P. B. V. Broke, giving an account of his having captured the French ship privateer. Prince Murat, having on board eighteen six pounders, and one hundred and twenty-seven men; five days at sea from L'Orient, and had not made any captures.
