THE MERCHANT BANKING COMPANY of STIRLING, and the Individual Partners thereof.

By fection 35th of the ftatute 33d of his present Majefty, it is, inter alia, enacted, that "The truttee shall be
obliged, within the space of one kalendar month after
the expiration of ten months (from the date of the sequestration), to make up a state of the debts entitled to
a share of the first dividend;" and it is farther enacted,
by the same section of the statute, that "On the sirst
lawful day after the expiration of one complete year
from the date of the first deliverance on the petition for
sequestration, the dividend shall be paid, and the trustee
shall give one month's previous notice thereof, by advertisement in the Cazetts."

Owing to the dissinculties the trustee has met with in
recovering the sequestrated sunds (of which nearly the
whole are yet outstanding), and particularly to the various questions, in which the estate has unfortunately
been involved with Andrew Belch, and which are not
yet terminated—he finds it will not be in his power to
make a dividend at 29th March 1856, the statutory period. Meanwhile states of the debts claimed upon, and
of the sunds so far as recovered, lie at the office of the
trustee, No. 24, George Street, open to the inspection
of all concerned.
