WHITEHALL, December 13. 1805.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Sir John Doyle, Bart. a Lieutenant-General of his Majesty's forces, Colonel of the 87th (or Prince of Wales's Irish) regiment of foot, and Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Guernsey, his royal licence and authority, that he may bear certain honourable additions, together with supporters, to his armorial ensigns, in consideration of the faithful and zealous exertions of the said Sir John Doyle in his Majesty's service on divers occasions, and particularly during the glorious operations of the British arms in Egypt, in conjunction with those of his Majesty's ally the Grand Signior; the said armorial distinctions being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office: And also to order, that this his Majesty's concession, and especial mark of his royal favour, be registered in his College of Arms.
