Copy of a letter from Admiral Young, Commander in Chief of his Majefty's fhips and veffels at Plymouth, to William Marfden, Efq. dated on board his Majefty's fhip Salvador del Mundo, Hamoaze, April 21, 1806.

SIR-I transmit you herewith, for the informa-tion of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a letter which I have received from the Commander of the Hind revenue cutter, giving an account of his having captured the French privateer brig L./Intrepide, of fourteen guns, and which he brought in this morning.

I have the fatisfaction to add, that the John, one

Sir,—I beg you will be pleafed to acquaint my Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, that, on Wednesday the 16th inst. having received information at Scilly, that a vessel had been captured off that island by a French brig privateer of 14 guns, I immediately got under weigh, and proceeded to sea in on Fricapt he 18th, had the fatisfaction of salling in with her, Scilly bearing N. E. three leagues; she hoised American colours, and allowed us to approach; fired a broadside into us, and a volley of musketry; then, with a crowd of fail she attempted to get off, depending on her superior failing; but, after a chace from nine A. SIR-I enclose, for the information of the Lord
