And whereas the purpose for which the said particulars were required has now been served:

Now, therefore, We, in exercise of the statutory powers conferred upon Us, do, by this Our Order, revoke as from the date hereof, the Regulations of 1916 and the Regulations of 1918.

HOUSING, TOWN PLANNING, &c., ACT, 1909.

THE CITY AND ROYAL BURGH OF GLASGOW.

ORDER of the Local Government Board for Scotland, authorising the Corporation of the City and Royal Burgh of Glasgow to prepare a Town Planning Scheme in respect of Lands at Kennyhill and Riddrie, situated wholly within the said Burgh.

WHEREAS the Corporation of the City and Royal Burgh of Glasgow (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation"), being the Local Authority within the said Burgh under the Housing, Town Planning, &c., Act, 1909, passed a Resolution on the twenty-third day of October 1913, applying to Us, the Local Government Board for Scotland, to authorise the Corporation to prepare a Town Planning Scheme in respect of lands situated at Kennyhill and Riddrie, and wholly within the said Burgh, all as shown on a certain map marked "Plan No. II.," and as referred to in the aforesaid resolution, and more particularly described in the Corporation's advertisements of their intention to apply to Us for authority to prepare the said Scheme:

And whereas the Resolution of the Corporation, together with the map above referred to, has been transmitted to Us, and We have inquired into the application and into the circumstances connected therewith:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board for Scotland, do hereby, under the provisions of sub-sections (2) and (3) of Section 54 of the Housing, Town Planning, &c., Act, 1909, authorise the Corporation to prepare a Town Planning Scheme with reference to the land (including land already built upon) to which the aforesaid application relates.

And We do further authorise the Corporation in the preparation of the Scheme as aforesaid to provide therein for the demolition or alteration of any of the buildings on the land included in the area in respect of which a scheme may be prepared as aforesaid, so far as may be necessary for carrying the Scheme into effect.

1. The making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord but excluding silk, worsted, and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles.
