She proved to be Le Pandour, of 18 guns, 6-pounders, (two of which were thrown overboard during the chace), and 150 men, command by M. Malingre, Capitaine de Vaisseau, from Senegal bound to France.

Rear-Admiral Stirling has ordered me to take possession of her. I have brought her into this anchorage, and have the honour to be, &c.
