Copy of a letter transmitted by Admiral Young.
Druid, Plymouth Sound, May 9.

MY LORD—I have the honour to inform you that on the 1st inst. I fell in with a French brig corvette, which, after a run of 160 miles we chased into the Squadron of Rear-Admiral Stirling, where she was brought to at eleven o'clock P.M. She proved to be Le Pandour, of 18 guns, 6-pounders, (two of which were thrown overboard during the chase), and 150 men, command by M. Malingre, Capitaine de Vaisseau, from Senegal bound to France.

Rear-Admiral Stirling has ordered me to take possession of her. I have brought her into this anchorage, and have the honour to be, &c.
