PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council:

His Majesty having taken into consideration the circumstances under which ships and goods, belonging to the inhabitants of Bremen, are detained under embargo, is pleased, by and with the advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the embargo now subsisting upon the said ships and goods be taken off; and that the said ships, with their cargoes, not being enemies property, be permitted to sail to any port not blockaded. And the Right Hon. the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
