The KING has been graciously pleased to give directions for the following appointments to the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, for services ren-

* The distinctions conferred in the London Gazette of the 14th October, 1919, and the rewards notified in this Gazette constitute the final war Honours list under the various categories enumerated for services in those theatres of war in which hostilities have not continued since the armistice and for services in connection with the war elsewhere. India excepted.

There still remain for final action certain lists for services in the Field since the armistice, special recommendations for officers and other ranks in accordance with the terms of Army Order 193 of 1919 (for services in the Field, for gallant conduct in escaping or attempting to escape from captivity, and for valuable and meritorious services rendered whilst in captivity), and recommenda-

tions for the Royal Red Cross.
