WHEREAS by Section 13 of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, it is provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, apply, with the necessary modifications and adaptations, in relation to the Air Council, the President of the Air Council, and the Air Force, and the officers and men thereof, and Air Force property or institutions, any of the enactments relating to the Army Council, the Secretary of State for the War Department, the Army, or the officers and soldiers thereof (including enactments conferring any powers, rights, exemption or abatement from taxation or immunities or imposing any duties or disabilities on such officers or soldiers) or to military property or institutions :

And whereas by certain Orders made under the said Section certain enactments have been applied in relation as aforesaid, and it is expedient so to apply the further enactment mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order :

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The enactment mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order, being an enactment relating to the Army Council, shall apply in relation to the Air Council, subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in the second column of that Schedule.

2. This Order may be cited as the Air Force (Application of Enactments) Order, 1920.

WHEREAS by virtue of an Order in Council, dated the 16th day of June 1915, made under the Ministry of Munitions Act, 1915, certain functions and work of the Army Council and the Secretary of State for War have been transferred to, and certain powers of the Army Council have become exercisable concurrently by, the Minister of Munitions :

And whereas the said Act provided that any Order in Council made thereunder might be varied or revoked by a subsequent Order in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

As and from such date as may be agreed between the Army Council and the Minister of Munitions the said Order in Council of the 16th day of June 1915, shall be revoked so far as it relates to functions and work of the Army Council or the Secretary of State for War, and any functions and work which under Order in Council have been transferred from the Army Council or the Secretary of State for War to the Minister shall be re-transferred from the Minister to the Army Council or Secretary of State for War as the case may require.

Provided that nothing in this Order shall affect the completion by the Minister of Munitions of any such transaction which in pursuance of such transfer he has entered into or for which he has become responsible, as may be agreed between the Minister of Munitions and the Army Council, or affect any powers of the Minister of Munitions with respect to the disposal of surplus Government property.

This Order may be cited as the Minister of Munitions (Re-Transfer of Powers) Order, 1920.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of May 1920, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :
