(b) The above General Minimum Time-Rates shall apply to Spinners employed on the ordinary Flyer frame commonly in use in the Jute Trade, when the Size of Yarn used on a Bobbin is not greater than the Normal Size as specified in this Sub-section, namely:-

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by Male or Female Workers employed on time-work in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows, that is to say :-

- (a) For Overtime on any day, except Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to time-and-a-half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.
- (b) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to double time, that is to say, twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(c) The Overtime Rates shall be payable
