An act to grant certain allowances out of the duties under the management of the Commissioners for the affairs of taxes to persons in respect of the number of their children. An act to provide for the regulating and securing the collection of the duties on spirits distilled in Ireland, and the Warehousing of such spirits for exportation. An act more effectually to regulate the collection of the duties on goods, wares, and merchandize imported or exported into or from Ireland, and the payment of bounties, allowances, and drawbacks thereon. An act for abolishing sees received by certain officers and other persons employed in the fervice of the customs in the port of London, and for regulating the attendance of officers and others so employed. An act for the better regulation of the office of Receiver General of the Post Office in England. An act for better encouraging the manuscure of thread lace in Great Britain. An act for reviving and continuing until the 25th day of March 1813, an act made in the forty-third year of his present Majesty for regulating the manner in which the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, shall hire and take up ships for their regular service. An act for enabling his Majesty to grant the Castle of Norwich, with the Common Gaol, Castle Hill, and certain land adjacent thereto, in the County of Norsolk, and for vesting the same in his Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said County for the use thereof; and for other purposes relating thereto. An act for paving, lighting, cleansing, and watching the burgh of Paisley, and suburbs thereof; for improving and forming certain streets, and erecting a Bridewell or Workhouse therein; and sor regulating the Police and Markets. An act to alter and amend the several acts passed for making and maintaining the Forth and Clydo Navigation. And a number of English Road and Private Acts.
