Copy of a Letter from the Earl of St. Vincent, K. B. Admiral and Commander in Chief, &c. to Wm. Marsden, Esq. dated on board the Hibernia, off Ushant, the 11th inft.

Sr.—I transmit herewith copies of a letter, with its inclosure, from Rear-Admiral Harvey, reciting a very neat exploit, conducted by Lieut. Mulcaster, First of the Minerva; whom I feel great pride in acknowledging as an eleve of my own:

I am, &c. ST. VINCENT.

Tonnant, off Cape Finisterre, June 23. 1806.

My Lord,—The weather being hazy, we did not fee the Minerva when the Prince's Royal parted company this morning. As we stood in shore, the Minerva joined; and Captain Collier fent me a letter, of which the inclosed is a copy. It displays an enterprizing spirit on the part of his Officers and men employed upon this fervice.

Sir,—The particular part of your orders having been accomplished, by my falling in with his Majesty's ships Renown and Warrior on the 21st instance of the enemy's trade carried on along this coast to the ports of Ferrol and Vigo, and having reason to believe there were some lugger privateers in Finisterre Bay, under the protection of the fort, I last night, it being calm, dispatched two boats from his Majesty's ship under my command, to scour the Bay.

From among the volunteers for this service, it fell to the lot of Lieut. Mulcaster, 1st Lieut. accompanied by Lieut. Menzies of the Royal Marrines, to command the cutter;—the barge was directed by Lieut. Ogle Moore.

This forenoon I had the satisfaction to see the boats returning, accompanied by five Spanish luggers, and chasse inarces, as per margin\*, mostly laden with wine, bound to Ferrol and Corunna. Lieut. Mulcaster speaks very handsomely of the support he received from the officers and petty seamen and marines employed on this affair.

I feel I should be deficient in my duty did I omit to state the circumstances attending the execution of this service, so creditable to Lieut. Mulcaster and his companions.
