Sir—I inclose, for the information of the Lorda Commissioners of the Admiralty, copies of letters from Captains Campbell and Bluett, of his Majesty's sloops Cygnet and Wasp, giving an account of the capture of a French national schooner and sloop, the latter his Majesty's late armed floop Dominica, which had been run away with by her, crew three or four days before, and carried to Guadaloupe, where she was immediately commissioned and manned with 75 men, and sent back with the schooner to attempt cutting out the merchant ships in Roseau, Bay, which was happily frustrated, and one wessel, only, which they had taken possession of, was recaptured.

The French General, Hortade, with a party of soldiers, were taken on board these vessels; what motives could have induced an officer of his rank to engage in such petry predatory wurfare. I am at a loss to guess, particularly as he was taken without any uniform whatever.

The Captain of the Duke of Montrose Packet deserves grea credit for his exertions; he received on board a party of the 46th regiment, and at the desire of the President got under weigh and chuced, and by his means the schooner was captured.
