SIR,—I have the honour to inform you, that in proceeding to Prince Rupert's Bay this morning, I received intelligence (per signal) from his Majesty's sloop Cygnet, that that anchorage, of an enemy in the S. W. quarter, which I immediately went in chase of, being a cutter and schooner, the former I captured, which proved to be the Napoleon privateer, (late his Majesty's cutter Dominica) commanded by Vincent Gautier, having 73 men, four of whom were of the 4th regiment of artillery, and 12 of the 26th regiment; she failed from Basseterre on the 23d instant.

I experienced the greatest satisfaction in being witness to the most gallant conduct and perseverance of his Majesty's Packet the Duke of Montrose, in capturing L'Imperial schooner (consort to the above cutter).

I am sorry to inform you, from the determination of the cutter to escape, if possible, she had two men killed.
