PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the 2nd day of March 1920, made in pursuance of the Summer Time Act, 1916, as amended by the Time (Ireland) Act, 1916, His Majesty was pleased to provide amongst other things that the period in the present year for which the said Act as so amended is to remain in force, should come to an end at two o'clock in the morning, Greenwich mean time, on Monday the 27th day of September.

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 11th day of March 1920, in pursuance of all powers enabling him in that behalf, His Majesty was pleased to make similar provision with respect to summer time in the Isle of Man :

And whereas it is expedient to extend the period for which summer time shall be observed during the present year :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

The above recited Orders in Council of the 2nd and 11th days of March 1920 shall respectively be modified and have effect as though for references therein to the twenty-seventh day of September, there were substituted references to the twenty-fifth day of October.
