WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty

was pleased to make regulations (called "the Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm; which regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that the regulation hereinafter mentioned should cease to have effect:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Regulation 30BB shall be revoked.

WHEREAS at St. Germain-en-Laye, on the 10th day of September 1919, a Treaty of Peace with Austria (hereinafter referred to as "the Treaty") was signed on behalf or His Majesty:
