

DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES (COAL AND FUEL EMERGENCY) (SCOTLAND) ORDER, 1920, MADE BY THE SECRETARY FOR SCOTLAND ON THE 20TH OCTOBER 1920, UNDER REGULATIONS 2J AND 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 2J as read with Regulation 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations and by arrangement with the Board of Trade, I hereby order as follows:—

The Local Authorities (Gas and Coal) (Scotland) Order, 1920, shall be construed as if after the words "the Coal (Emergency) Order, 1920" where they occur in Clauses 1 and 4 of the said Order, there were inserted the words "and the Coal and Fuel Emergency Order, 1920."

On the night of 25/26 March 1920, when operating near Lefke (Anatolia), this officer was ordered to destroy Lefke Bridge. Although subjected to enemy rifle and machine-gun fire at close range, he gallantly carried out the task allotted to him. Throughout the operation Major Grimshaw set a fine example to his men.

Capt. Geoffrey Percival Troughton-Dean, 24th Punjabis, I.A. (Dated 26th August 1920.)

For gallantry and skilful leadership near Ismid, on the 15th June 1920. It was entirely due to his boldness and coolness under heavy fire at short range that his company succeeded in reaching Ismid.
