His Majesty the KING has been graciously
pleased to award the Edward Medal in silver to
Isaac Barnard and John Barnard under the
following circumstances:—

On the 25th September 1919, a great rush of
mud occurred at the Wesselson Mine, Kimberley.
The rush came from two places, forty-five feet
apart, and filled up two of the passes for a
distance of about a hundred feet.

At first it was thought that all the workers
had escaped; but, on inquiries being made, it
was found that fourteen natives were missing.
It is customary after a mud rush to leave the
mud alone for two or three days before attempt-
ing to clear it away; but, as men were missing,
