If any person wilfully makes any false statement with a view to obtaining a certificate of exemption for himself or for another person he will be liable on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months for each offence, and if any person is otherwise guilty of any contravention of the Regulations dealing with exemption he will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £10 for each offence.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the provisions in that behalf contained in the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, that it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council Orders under the title of :—

- (1) "The Ministry of Transport (Secretary for Scotland Transfer and Exception of Powers) Order, 1920."
- (2) "The Ministry of Transport (Scottish Board of Health Transfer and Exception of Powers) Order, 1920."
- (3) "The Ministry of Transport (Board of Agriculture for Scotland Transfer and Exception of Powers) Order, 1920."

Whereby the 1st day of November 1920 will be fixed as the date as from which the powers and duties of :—

- (a) The Secretary for Scotland,
  - (b) The Scottish Board of Health, and
  - (c) The Board of Agriculture for Scotland
- in relation to the matters specified in the said Act will, by virtue of the said Act, be transferred to the Minister of Transport with such exceptions as may be specified in the said Orders.
