But excluding:—

(a) the operations specified in the Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) Order, 1913;

(b) the making of buttons or any operations

incidental thereto;

(c) the making of coffin furniture or any operations incidental thereto;

(d) the making of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, hair-curlers, snap fasteners or safety pins or any operations incidental thereto;

(e) the making of steel pens and the making of stationers' metal sundries or other similar metal articles when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;

(f) the minting of coinage of the realm;

(g) the process of hand-embossing.

## PART VI.

Section I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning Higher Rates of Wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of Wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 23rd October 1920. Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary, Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain), 5 Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2. It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

# MAINTENANCE OF LIVE STOCK (SCOT-LAND) ORDER OF 1920.

The Board of Agriculture for Scotland by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the "Maintenance of Live Stock Act, 1915," and for the purpose of maintaining a sufficient Stock of Cattle, Sheep and Swine, do hereby order as follow:-

Restriction of Slaughter of Animals In-calf, In-Lamb, or In-Pig.

1. No Animal In-Calf, In-lamb, or In-pig, shall be slaughtered or sold or exposed for Sale to be slaughtered.

## Exceptions from Restrictions.

- 2. The restriction of slaughter imposed by the preceding Article of this Order shall not apply to-
  - (a) Slaughter of an Animal under the powers conferred by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, or any Order made thereunder, or
  - (b) Slaughter of any animal rendered desirable by illness or accidental injury,
  - (c) Slaughter of any animal authorised by a licence granted by the Board of Agriculture for Scotland or an Officer of that Board on cause shown.

#### Power of Entry.

3. For the purpose of executing and enforcing this Order, any Officer of the Board of Agriculture for Scotland may subject to any directions given by that Board and upon production, if so required, of his appointment, enter any slaughter house or other premises on which animals are slaughtered for human food and examine any animal or carcase therein.

# Application of Order.

4. This Order applies to Scotland.

Revocation of Existing Order.

to 5. This Order shall come into operation on the third day of November nineteen hundred nd twenty.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the "Maintenance of Live Stock (Scotland) Order of 1920."
