List for duty with Our Officers' Training Corps.

(5) The peace-time commissioned service of an Officer for the period when his military service is available only on mobilisation.

Tenthly.—It is ordained that the recipient of this Decoration shall be permitted to wear with it any "Volunteer Officers' Decoration" which may have been awarded to him, provided that he has completed the full periods of qualifying service for both Decorations; also any "Imperial Yeomanry Long Service and Good Conduct Medal," "Volunteer Long Service Medal," or "Territorial Force Efficiency Medal," which may have been awarded to him, provided that he has completed the full periods of qualifying service for both Decoration and Medal.

Eleventhly.—It is ordained that the names of those upon whom we may be pleased to confer the Decoration shall be published in the London Gazette, and a Register thereof kept in the office of Our Principal Secretary of State for War.

Twelfthly.—In order to make such additional provision as shall effectually preserve pure this most honourable distinction, it is ordained:—

(1) That a recipient of the "Territorial Decoration" who suffers death by sentence of Court-Martial, or is cashiered, dismissed, or removed from Our Naval, Military, or Air Forces for misconduct shall forfeit the

Decoration (unless otherwise recommended by Our Army Council).

(2) That if a recipient of the "Territorial Decoration" is convicted by the Civil Power, or is dealt with under the Probation of Offenders Act, 1907, or is called upon to resign his Commission, he shall be liable to a like forfeiture on the recommendation of Our Army Council.

(3) That the forfeiture shall be carried out under authority bearing Our Royal Sign Manual; and that the name of the recipient shall thereupon be erased from the Register of those upon whom the Decoration has been conferred.

(4) That We, Our Heirs and Successors, shall at all times have power to restore a forfeited "Territorial Decoration."

(5) That a notice of forfeiture or of restoration shall in every case be published in the London Gazette.

Lastly.—We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these regulations, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Royal Sign Manual.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this 13th day of October, 1920, in the eleventh year of Our Reign.
