

EMERGENCY POWERS ACT, 1920.

THE COAL AT SEAPORTS (TRANSPORT INLAND) DIRECTIONS, 1921.

The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Emergency Regulations, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby direct as follows:—

1. No coal which is standing in or about any of the ports in the Districts named in the Schedule hereof shall be transported inland without the permission in writing of the Secretary for Mines or his duly authorised representative

2. The persons mentioned in the said Schedule are hereby authorised to act as representatives of the Secretary for Mines in the Districts for which they are in the said Schedule respectively nominated.

3. These Directions may be cited as the Coal at Seaports (Transport Inland) Directions, 1921, and shall come into force on the date of signing hereof.
