

Act, 1894, shall apply to any aircraft or any part thereof or cargo thereof found derelict at sea outside the limits of the United Kingdom and brought within the limits of the United Kingdom.

- (7) In their application to aircraft, Sections 511 (2) and 536 (1) of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall have effect as though for references to the master of the vessel there were substituted references to the commander or person in charge of the aircraft.
- (8) In its application to aircraft, Section 516 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall have effect as though the words "commissioned officer on full pay in the Air Service of His Majesty" were inserted after the words "justice of the peace."
- (9) The provisions of Section 517 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall not apply in the case of aircraft.
- (10) The term "vessel" in Sections 530 to 532 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, both inclusive, shall include any aircraft.
- (11) The provisions of Sections 538 to 543, both inclusive, of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall not apply in the case of aircraft.
- (12) In their application to aircraft, Sections 548 (2) and 550 (3) of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, shall have effect as though for the word "maritime" there were substituted the word "aeronautical."
- (13) The provisions of Section 6 of the Maritime Conventions Act, 1911, and of Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall not apply in the case of aircraft.

COUNTY COUNCIL ELECTORAL DIVISIONS OF THE COUNTY OF LANARK.

ORDER BY THE SECRETARY FOR SCOTLAND.

Whereas the contents and boundaries of the electoral divisions of the County of Lanark were determined by an Order under the hand and seal of the Secretary for Scotland, dated 16th May 1899.

And whereas the contents and boundaries of the electoral divisions of the Burgh of Motherwell were altered by an Order under the hand and seal of the Secretary for Scotland, dated 20th September 1907.

And whereas by Section 4 of the Motherwell and Wishaw Burgh Order Confirmation Act, 1920, the Burghs of Motherwell and Wishaw were amalgamated, and by Section 5 of the said Act the boundaries of the amalgamated burgh

were extended to include certain areas situated within the County Council Electoral Divisions of Dalzell and Newmains, and by Section 9 of the said Act the amalgamated burgh as extended was divided into wards.

And whereas the County Council of the County of Lanark have applied to me for an Order in terms of Section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, to provide for the County Council Electoral Divisions within the Burgh of Motherwell and Wishaw being made to correspond with the new municipal wards of the said burgh and for the necessary adjustment of the electoral divisions of Dalzell and Newmains.

And whereas I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the application of the County Council.

Now therefore, I, the Right Honourable Robert Munro, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by Section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, do hereby order and determine that the contents and boundaries of the electoral divisions within the Burgh of Motherwell and Wishaw and of the electoral divisions of Dalzell and Newmains shall be as follows, viz.:—
